1. THIS IS NOT JUST AN ORDINARY FELLOWSHIP NIGHT MEETING, or Fellowship Day, it's not even Sunday, how about that? It's Wednesday, isn't it? But guess what day it is? Why are we having Fellowship Meeting today, David? (David: Because it's your BirthDay!) Oh my, look at this, would ya? Excuse us folks, she can't leave him alone, she's got to have her lovin' from her favourite lover! Oh, such love! Such love! (Tech: I'm cuddling, cuddling David!) Yes, you sure are! (Tech: Cuddling & cuddling David!) You're cuddling & cuddling, David! Haven't we got a better mike than that? See how poor we are? We have to patch up these old mikes with Scotch tape! Well, PTL! Hallelujah! That makes a good picture there to show you, the bread alongside the Word, which is the Bread of Life, as Jesus said His body was to be eaten as bread for our bodies that we may be healed! PTL!

2. OH MY, ALL THIS LOVEMAKING GOING ON RIGHT HERE IN CHURCH! (David: I think she thinks it's Heaven where the Love Feast is!) Yes! It sure is Heaven here, that's for sure! It's such a Love Feast! Oh my, what loving! What loving! Behold how these Christians love one another! Let brotherly & sisterly love continue! Amen! (Family: Amen!) PTL: TYJ: Hallelujah! (Tech: I'm cuddling David!) You're cuddling David! Doooh! Doooh! My oh my!

3. I SHOULD HAVE SHINED MY SHOES TONIGHT! I forgot I was going to be on television tonight & I didn't shine my shoes. Tsk, ts, tsk, tsk! Now children, don't you ever neglect to shine your shoes, especially when you're going to church or television or M/M or Church in the Home or Church of Love or Open the Door for the Children. (Tech: I'm holding on the board.) Yes, you're holding on to the board, that's for sure. She's hanging on to the board. Are you afraid that David will carry you away? Get around here you little rascal, & show what a little rascal you are! (Tech: Hey, David is carrying me away!) That's so sweet! This is going to be a classic! A classy classic!

4. DO YOU THINK HE'S GOING TO RUN OFF WITH YOU LIKE YOUNG LOCHINVAR? Have you heard about the story of Lochinvar? (David: No.) His girlfriend was about to marry another man because he'd been gone so long hunting for the Holy Grail. So

what do you suppose happened? Young Lochinvar was a young knight on a valiant steed, a big horse. Valiant steed means brave horse! I have to interpret my old English for you youngsters! Here we've got the original rock & roll going on here! Honey, you're not supposed to do that in church, you're supposed to do that in bed!

5. SO YOUNG LOCHINVAR HEARD ABOUT IT JUST IN TIME! He came home from looking for the Holy Grail--something like this cup, I think it was made out of gold or silver, wasn't it? It was supposed to have been the very one that the Lord drank from at the Last Supper & he was looking for it. Some church had it or some heathen had carried it away or something. Does anybody remember the story? Was that Lochinvar? I know that there were several knights who were looking for it. Sir Lancelot & Sir Galahad were looking for it, a lot of them were looking for it in those days.

6. BUT WHILE LOCHINVAR WAS GONE, SOME OTHER GUY WAS MAKING OUT WITH HIS SWEET-HEART! Well, she thought he was gone for good, 'cause he hadn't been back for two or three years, I think. Remember the story? They don't read stories like that anymore, huh? They don't tell kids exciting stories like that! (To Cameraman:) You're missing the action, Honey, the action is down there on the floor! Ha! Yes, David's going to save you! David's going to do more than that from the way he looks!

7. THIS IS THE CHURCH OF LOVE, BELOVED, & WE BELIEVE IN PRACTICING WHAT WE PREACH! Here we have the Church of Love & they're lovin' up on the floor! Well anyhow, you see, old stories like that are too tame for this generation--this is the kind of action that has to keep them interested! They gotta have more action. (David: This is the New Testament!) This is a New Testament Church, not Old Testament, old hat like Lochinvar! This is a New Testament Church where there's real revolutionary action going on! Are you watching all this action now? Here's where the action is!

8. WE'RE HAVING A LOVEMAKING MATCH! I don't know whether it's a lovemaking match or a wrestling match! Oh my goodness, oh my goodness! She's learning at an early age! (Tech: I'm David's little sheepy!) You're David's little sheepy, that's right,

& he's cuddling his little sheepy, his little lamb. I'm glad to know that's what you're doing! This is merely a cuddle in our Family, Beloved, merely a little cuddle! Well Lochinvar, you might as well get lost! They're not interested in Lochinvar!

9. WELL, SHE WAS ABOUT TO GET MARRIED IN THE CHURCH & HE JUST RODE IN & galloped up the steps of the church on his horse & right into the church & swept her off her feet & galloped away with her! (Family: Wow!) And she liked it! It's kind of like that "Be So Happy" song! Remember that song? (Techi: I'm David's littl' sheepy!) Well, I'm glad to know that you're his little sheepy. That's very good, Honey, & that's why he's protecting you so well. (Techi: Sheepy was stuck!) Watch out he doesn't shear you now. Sheepy was stuck? (Sara: Better pick on somebody your own size, Honey!) Oh, that wouldn't be as much fun!

10. HERE'S THE CHURCH OF LOVE 'N ACTION, BELOVED! What a Birthday Party, huh? What a night for some real birthday action! This is all completely unstaged, unheard, unexpected! They're just playing on the livingroom floor as we were getting staged here & set up for our little Bible Story. But our story seemed to be a little too tame for this pair! (Techi: Save his little sheep!) You want me to save you from him or what? (Techi: David save me!) "David save me," she says! "Save me, David!" (Techi: Save me, David!) Oh my, oh my! (David: I think I should say that.) Yes!

11. YES, YOU COULD SAY, "DADDY, SAVE THE SHEPHERD FROM THE LITTLE SHEEP!" Are you sure you're a sheep & not a wolf? Huh? You look to me like you're wolfin' up David! Looks like you're about to wolf David. Oh, you're not a wolf, you're a nice little sheep, of course! And David is a good shepherd! That's right. Is that a Rita Rita Ronka ride? Shhh! Shh! We're on camera! There's no bedroom talk in here now please, we're about to have Communion! Honey, poor David, you're going to knock the dinner out of him! You're going to knock the wind out of him! Dear shepherd is going to be a tired shepherd after you have attacked him like this! I think it's the shepherd who needs saving from the sheep!

12. WE DON'T ALWAYS HAVE THESE WRESTLING MATCHES EVERY COMMUNION, DO WE? I mean, this is completely totally unplanned, unprogrammed, unscheduled, unheard! (Dora: We're going to have Communion,

would you like that?) Honey, when she's having so much fun how can she stop for Communion? She says, "I'm in the mood to carry me off a shepherd!" David, you ought to look at Alfred up there & say, "Save me!" (David: Save me!) Save me from this sheep that's attacking me! David? (David: Yes?) Tell'm to save you from the sheep that's attacking you. (David: Save me from the sheep that's attacking me!) Ha! OK, I think we've had enough wrestling match now, what do you say? OK? All right. There's a Rita Rita Ronka ride! OK, that oughta shake down your dinner!

13. WELL, PTL! TYJ! THANK GOD WE DON'T HAVE TO STAND ON FORMALITY IN OUR CHURCH! In fact, we don't even have to stand, much less have any formality! Look how strong he is! This is the finale, the shepherd is carrying the sheep away! The shepherd is carrying the sheep away! Here it is. Turn around a little bit, David, so they can see her face too. Yes, there we are. No hands, Daddy! Look, no hands! You are strong, boy! Well, he's a shepherd, he's got to be strong! Especially when he has such fat sheep! Shepherd, carry her away, please do! Shepherd, take the hint! Carry her away! (Techi: Daddy's lost sheep.) He has a hard time getting rid of her, she has a scissor grip on him!

14. HEY LOOK, MAYBE THIS WILL INTEREST YOU! (Techi: Yes!) Yes, that did the trick! There's only one thing she likes better than David & that's Communion! (Techi: I want to have Communion!) All right, wait a minute now. Are you going to serve the bread? (Techi: Yes!) All right, you & David, you help her. Wait a minute, we've gotta pray for it first. David, you pray for it, OK? That's a good idea. It didn't say that the preacher or the pastor or the teacher had to pray, did it? Jesus did the first one, but I guess anybody can pray for it after that, right? OK, now don't break the dish, hold it tight because he's going to put the crumbs in there. It's pretty hard. David's going to tear off the pieces & put them in while you hold the plate, OK? All right, amen.

15. (DAVID: LORD, BLESS THIS BREAD THAT SYMBOLISES YOUR BODY & thank You for this cup of Your New Testament, & thank You for this Bread that represents Your Body which is broken for us. And You said, as often as you do this, do it in remembrance of Me. So we pray You bless this, in Jesus' name. Amen.) Amen. What do you say, Techi? Can you say amen? (Techi: Let me break it.) It's pretty hard to break. Let her

try, see if she can break it. Good for her! What a strong girl! My goodness, she did it! She broke bread today! We're breaking bread. All right, now you put that one down & you tear that up in little pieces for everybody. Let her do it, Honey, she's enjoying it.

16. (TECHI: I'M TAKING A LITTLE PIECE!) Oh, you're taking your cut. Well, the Bible says, "Muzzle not the ox that treadeth out the corn!" Wait until we pass it around. You've got to tear it up into little pieces first, Techi. Put it in big pieces, not such little pieces, like this. OK, you fix it. Will you do it? Not such small crumbs! Oh my! Here Techi, take a little bit more, that's right. I think we have enough now, don't we, David?

17. TECHI GETS THE INSIDE, SHE GETS THE JUMP ON THE REST OF US EATING THE COMMUNION BREAD! That's why she's so robust & healthy, she eats a lot of the Lord's Body every Communion! She eats at least half of the Lord's Body every Communion. She really believes in Communion, let me tell you! That's why she's so healthy, TPL! All right, now you can take your bread away. PTL! Hallelujah! TPL! (Sings "Break thou the Bread of Life".)

18. DID EVERYBODY GET A PIECE OF THE LORD'S BODY? He said, "This is My body which is broken for you, this do in remembrance of Me. And as oft as ye do it, ye do it in remembrance of Me & you do show the Lord's death till He come." (Techi: I'm coming with the bread!) OK, you take care of that. All right, let's partake together. Why do we partake all together?—To show that we're all one. It's all from one loaf of bread, & when we all eat our portion together that means we have all suddenly become one. Of course we were one before this, but it's a sign that we are one! PTL! TYJ!

19. IN JESUS' NAME, BLESS IT & MAKE IT A BLESSING & HEAL EVERYBODY THAT NEEDS HEALING TONIGHT, LORD, Maria especially, who's been feeling sick today, give her strength, Lord. You said because some people neglect this, many are weak & sickly among you & some even sleep, some even die because they neglect & they don't discern Thy body that it's for healing, & they don't partake of it by faith. So help them to discern Thy body tonight. Even Techi knows that this is for Thy body & for our healing. So help them to discern Thy body tonight so that they won't be weak & sickly. (Techi drops plate.)

20. (TECHI: I BROKE THE BREAD!) Oop,

that's OK, we'll get it! Just pick it up. If you have a little accident you just pick it up, that's all, there you are! But now the crumbs are dirty so don't eat them. Honey, don't eat off the floor like a little puppy dog! You're not supposed to eat off the floor, are you children? No children are supposed to eat off the floor, you get all dirt & hairs in your mouth. See? It didn't taste good, did it? (Techi spits.) Don't let the Lord's body fall to the floor & get mixed up with the dirt, all right? So why don't you pick up these crumbs & put 'em on here, but don't eat 'em! Mommy, look she's cleaning it up, & we'll vacuum it tomorrow.

21. ALL RIGHT, NOW I WAS RIGHT AT THE END OF A VERY SERIOUS PRAYER WHEN WE HAD THIS LITTLE CALAMITY, but accidents happen in the best of families. Of course, as I've often said, the best way to do is make it impossible for them to happen, such as taking the dish away from Techi here might have made it impossible for her to drop it. (Techi: I have to go potty.) OK, good girl! Go potty quick with Dora, that's a good idea! Quick, quick, quick! Hurry! We have all conveniences here in our church of Love! (Techi: I had a little accident with the Lord's body.)

22. WELL, I THINK ONE REASON YOU HAD THIS LITTLE ACCIDENT IS BECAUSE YOU DRANK SO MUCH TEA TONIGHT! You did drink a lot of tea! I really thought it was quite a bit, but you're a good girl & you told us you had to go potty, didn't she? (Techi: I had a little accident with my little pants!) I see. Well, that's because you waited too long to tell us. You should have told us sooner, OK? All right. Bye-Bye! Thank you, Honey, for a good show. Everybody say, "Bye-Bye Techi." (Family: Bye-Bye, Techi!) Good! A hand for a good performance!

23. WE DON'T WANT TO DISCOURAGE OUR CHILDREN WHEN THEY FEEL DRAMATIC & PUT ON QUITE A SHOW, even if it's right in the middle of Communion! It's a good time for her to make her exit too, PTL! I think she did very well, don't you? I mean, she behaved very well, she kept everybody busy & occupied & entertained!

24. ALL RIGHT, SCENE ONE JUST ENDED & THE HEROINE WHO WAS SAYING THE SHEPHERD HAD A SLIGHT ACCIDENT BETWEEN THE ELEMENTS, & we haven't quite finished our Communion. She's particularly fond of Communion bread, I don't know why, but I think it's maybe because it's the only time she ever gets to eat bread. David likes it too. Why not? I

mean, it's the Lord's body & the more you eat the healthier you should be, right? No reason why not! Just don't eat those dirty crumbs that came off the floor.

25. WELL, YOU'RE JUST SEEING EVERYTHING AS IT IS, FOLKS: This is the way we do it.

No formalities. We are the opposite extreme of high church. We are strictly low church, & you've no idea how low! So, PTL! But I think we love the Lord just as much, maybe more, although we are a bit informal & a bit, what would you say—icoroclastic? A bit individualistic, informal & untraditional!

26. ALL RIGHT, PTL! ARE WE READY NOW FOR THE REST OF OUR COMMUNION? This is the Lord's blood. David, you did such a good job tonight of serving the bread & praying for the bread! I think we ought to let him handle the wine too, huh? You pray for the wine. He quoted so much of that, I bet you could quote the whole chapter, huh? Or a lot of those verses. Can you quote while you're praying? Can you quote the verses about the wine? Let's see.

27. WE'RE GOING TO LET DAVID TAKE CARE OF THE WINE TONIGHT, HE'S OUR HEAD USHER. He's our chief deacon. Here's the deacon & there's the deaconess over there. David is the deaconess & David is the deacon. You know how I know they're deacon & deaconess? Because they're waiting on tables. And deacons & deaconesses wait on tables, & they're waiting on the Lord's Table tonight, serving the Lord's Supper.

28. DAVID ALREADY DID A MASTERFUL JOB OF PRAYING FOR & SERVING THE BREAD, NOW WE'RE GOING TO LET HIM DO THE WINE, OK? After the same manner Jesus took the cup & what did He do next? If He took the cup after the same manner that He took the bread, what would He do first? (David: Pray first.) Pray, that's right. So let's pray for it, shall we? (David: Lord, bless this wine. You said it's a symbol of the New Testament & You said when Jesus took the cup, when He had supped He said, 'Take, eat, this is the blood of the New Testament in My blood, as often as ye eat this bread & drink this cup ye do show the Lord's death till He come.' So Lord bless this wine & help it to be good, in Jesus' name. Amen.)

29. AND WHAT WAS THE LAST THING HE SAID? (DAVID: DRINK YE ALL OF IT.) Everybody drink it. Drink ye all of it! Alrighty, thank you, Son: Who are you going to pass it to first, Daddy or your little sister? Be careful! Oh, oh! We had a slight accident looking at Daddy. Well, that's just

to make all of you folks out there feel not so bad, because you can see we all have accidents. You're really washed in the Blood tonight, Boy! Honey, it's because you're not holding on tight enough! You can't expect to set this glass on your knee, it will not stay. So, praise God! If you're a waiter you're supposed to wear an apron, so when you serve the Lord's Supper maybe you'd better wear an apron after this.

30. THAT WAS SUCH A BEAUTIFUL PRAYER! I guess the Lord just didn't want you to get too proud for having prayed such a beautiful prayer. All the whole family the whole World over would have been envious of having such a wonderful perfect boy & think, "Well, my children could never be like that & know so much Scripture & be such a good little preacher & serve Communion so beautifully", so then the Lord let you spill it to show'm that you make mistakes too.

31. (DAVID: I GOT WASHED IN THE BLOOD!) And that cheered everybody up to know that you had to get washed in the blood too, that's right. Well now, what do you say you pick it up now with two hands & don't try to balance it on your knee anymore, OK? It won't balance. You're not a juggler, hang on tight! All right, & the Lord said for us to all drink of it.

32. I WAS JUST ASKING YOU AN IMPORTANT QUESTION! & he got so excited about passing it to his Daddy that he spilt it! I asked him who he was going to pass it to first. (David: To Daddy!) All right, thank you. PTL! Jesus said this is His Blood shed for us, the New Testament in His Blood, for our sins. And as often as we do this we show His death until He comes, TYJ! PTL! Don't forget you need to drink a little too! PTL! TYJ! And can I borrow a little bit of your towel because I got quite a bit of blood on me tonight too! (David: I did too.) (To Sue:)

33. DON'T WORRY ABOUT THE FLOOR, HONEY! So what? If you're wondering what's going on right here down at my feet, dear Sue is mopping up the floor where we spill a little bit of the wine. PTL! Well as you can see, this is strictly an informal Communion! We don't stand on form or ceremonies! We don't have any forms or ceremonies, in fact, & we don't stand either! We just sit! Here David, you might need this to keep your knees warm after getting so wet. PTL! All right! TYJ! Amen! Hallelujah! TYL! TYJ!

34. (SINGS:)"ARE YOU WASHED IN THE BLOOD,

IN THE SOUL-CLEANSING BLOOD OF THE LAMB?

Are your garments spotless, are they white as snow? Are you washed in the Blood of the Lamb? Put aside your garments that are stained with sin, and be washed in the Blood of the Lamb. There's a fountain flowing for the soul unclear, oh be washed in the Blood of the Lamb!" That's an old-timer we've never sung! "Are you washed in the Blood, in the soul-cleansing Blood of the Lamb? Are your garments spotless, are they white as snow? Are you washed in the Blood of the Lamb?" (Sings: "Nothing but the Blood of Jesus!")

35. NOW SEE, I DID JUST WHAT I TOLD YOU ADULTS NOT TO DO. When children are singing, don't pitch it so low that they can't even hit the first note! I pitched it too low. That's my natural key, natural range to start off low like that, but that's double bass baritone way down in the basement! That's why they call it bass because it comes out of the basement! Are you saving that for your little sister? That was sweet of you, Honey, he's rescuing her little bracelet so she won't lose it.

36. INSTEAD OF THAT, LET'S PITCH IT A LITTLE HIGHER FOR THE CHILDREN! & remember to always pitch things a little higher for the children. They are sopranos usually, & they can sing it higher than most of you adults. Shall we pitch it higher? (Sings it again!) See how much louder they came out? How much better they sang when we pitched it the right key? How about "There's Power in the Blood"? (Sings it.)

37. AND IF WE WANT TO SING FOR MOM, THEIR KID SHOW DOWN THERE, we're going to have to sing: "There is power, Kid Power, wonder-working power in the Blood of the Lamb! There is power, Kid Power, wonder-working power in the precious Blood of the Lamb!" "Cause they've got a Kid Power outfit down there. We've got some Kid Power here too, haven't we? (Family: Amen!) We've got a lot of Kid Power right here & we're gonna use it tonight, because the other nights we got so involved with Bible Study we almost forgot about the kids & almost forgot about the flannelgraph!"

38. I ALWAYS WANT TO CALL IT FELTOGRAM because that's what it was when it first came out. It was a patented process when it first came out, not everybody could use it. They had to buy'm just from this special company that made'm & they were called Feltograms, because they were grams or pictures written on felt, in other words, made on felt, & they had a felt board. Now they found out they could use

any old kind of cheap material like flannel even. Flannel is something you just even make nightgowns out of, & shirts, & it's cheap, & felt was pretty expensive. They make hats out of felt & that's expensive.

39. BUT NOW INSTEAD OF A FELTOGRAM IT'S A FLANNELGRAPH, which means the same thing really, except that they use flannel instead of felt & they call it graph instead of gram. Graph, see that means writing. Gram is like a telegram, that's faster & costs more money than just a straight letter. Anybody can write a letter, but you've gotta be rich to send a telegram.

40. SO WE CAME DOWN OUT OF THE RICH FELTOGRAMS TO THE CHEAP FLANNELGRAPHS that anybody can make & anybody can do! Good idea? (Family: Yes!) Otherwise the feltograms would have just been limited to the rich. Now all of us poor people can have flannelgraphs & everybody can have a nice picture on a board like this. Didn't they make a nice board here? Looks to me like that's a new board, is it? I don't know, but it's beautiful whichever it is.

41. SO: PTL! HALLELUJAH! WELL, DAVID WHAT BOOK ARE WE STUDYING TONIGHT? (DAVID: DANIEL!) And where's your textbook? There it is! Good thing Mommy had it handy! It's a school & a Bible Study, a Bible class & a Bible School, & this is what we have here tonight, isn't it? We have a Bible School. We're going to have Bible School tonight & this is Bible class. So what is our school book? (David: The Bible.)

42. TELL ALL THE KIDS OUT THERE IN VIDEO-LAND, WHAT'S OUR SCHOOL BOOK? (David: What's our school book?—The Bible.) Right! I bet some of them got the right answer too! Our school book is the Bible & we study the Bible. And what kind of Bible are we studying tonight. (David: Daniel 1!) Daniel 1! And what is that about? Huh? (David: The Endtime.) That's right!

43. AND WHAT ARE SOME OF THE PEOPLE WE STUDY ABOUT IN THERE? Especially in this chapter we study about one man. (David: Daniel.) Well, not so much about Daniel. Daniel got the message, but who was he telling us about in this chapter? A very bad man! (David: I know! The Antichrist!) OK, that's right. Did you get that? Say that again, David. (David: The Antichrist!) The Antichrist, that's right: See, David doesn't have all the answers, David has a few. But between'm they know it all!

44. LIKE THE LITTLE BOY SAID, "ME & MY BROTHER KNOW EVERYTHING!" So they said,

"Well, what's electricity?" He said, "Well, that's one of the things my brother knows!" So between the two of 'm, she & her brother know everything about the Bible, & all about the Antichrist & Daniel 11th Chapter, & if David can't answer it, why, David's going to answer it! Well, let Grandpa get his Bible now. All you dear little children out there get your Bibles. Everybody got a Bible? (Family: Yes!)

45. ALL YOU DEAR OLD FOLKS GET YOUR GLASSES: Where are mine please? I'm sorry we forgot that part of our equipment. That'll give me a chance to take a little swallow of tea! Did you find them? Thank you, Honey, very good. All right! Let's try this pair of glasses tonight & see if I can see the Truth any more clearly than I did last time! Would you hold Grandpa's Bible for him a moment while Grandpa tries to clean his glasses?

46. IT'S THE 11TH CHAPTER OF DANIEL WE'RE STUDYING & meanwhile all you folks out there are scrambling around, running back to your trailers for your Bibles & running back to your bedrooms for your Bibles like everybody here is doing! Well, I haven't got a handkerchief, I don't have a tissue, so I'm going to show you a new revolutionary way to clean your glasses!

47. DON'T THINK YOU CAN'T CLEAN YOUR GLASSES JUST BECAUSE YOU DON'T HAVE A TISSUE or a handkerchief or a napkin or somebody's shirt-tail: Or I used to clean mine with my tie, or I cleaned 'm with my bathrobe belt. But when I don't have anything else to clean my glasses with, let me show you how to do it! You want to see? (Uses finger!) Presto-chango, a very good way to clean your glasses! Just make sure that your hands are clean. A very revolutionary way to clean your glasses. David.

48. THIS SORT OF REMINDS ME OF TH' STORY ABOUT THE RICHMAN & THE POORMAN. Did you ever hear that one? Richman, Poorman? (David: Who's the Beggarman or thief?!) Do you know what the difference is between the richman & the poorman? (David: One's rich & the other one poor.) Yes, but how can you tell the difference between a richman & a poorman? (David: A richman wears fancy clothes & the poorman wears ragged clothes & he cleans his glasses with a handkerchief & the poorman cleans his glasses like that.) The richman cleans his glasses with a handkerchief & the poorman cleans his glasses like I'm going to show in just a minute.

49. THERE'S ANOTHER WAY TO TELL THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN A RICHMAN & A POORMAN. Now

I know what some of you think I'm going to say, some of you think I'm going to tell you, well, the richman sleeps with a canopy over his head & the poorman sleeps with a can o' pee under the bed! Some of you'll get that after awhile!

50. WHAT IS IT THAT A RICHMAN PUTS IN HIS POCKET BUT A POORMAN THROWS AWAY? (David: A tissue.) Well, if you were talking about Daddy you'd probably be right, because I won't even throw away a tissue till I've used it a whole lot & it's really all gummed up & practically a spitball & then I'll throw it away! You just about hit it right, a tissue. Well, you were very close because if you don't have a tissue, what do you use instead of a tissue? (David: A handkerchief!) A handkerchief.

51. SO THE RICHMAN WHEN HE BLOWS HIS NOSE HE TAKES OUT A NICE HANKERCHIEF. Where's that tissue? Let me show you how we do it. He takes out a nice handkerchief like this & he daintily blows his nose like that! He's like the rich young man who came to the evangelist's meeting one night. This is a true story that happened to the famous Negro evangelist Tyndell. Not Tyndale the Bible translator, but a man who was named many years later after him, Tyndell. I told you this story in one of the old Letters.

52. HE HAD HEARD THEY WERE HAVING A GREAT REVIVAL IN THIS TENT MEETING, so he came into the meeting, he wanted to see what it was all about, all this big stir & talk about a revival, what is a revival? What is that? What do they mean by revival? (David: Reviving.) What is it to revive people? What do you do to revive 'm? Anybody know? Anybody out there know? (Sue: Bring 'm to life.)

53. WHEN SOMEBODY'S DROWNING & YOU PULL 'M OUT OF THE WATER, YOU TRY TO DO WHAT? (David: Revive them!) Tell the folks out in Videoland: (David: You try to revive them.) How do you try to revive them? You try to do what God did when He first made man! What did He do? He made man out of the dust of the Earth but He breathed into his nostrils, what? (David: The breath of life.) Tell them! (David: The breath of life!) He breathed into his nostrils the breath of life! And so... (David: Man became a living creature!) I've gotta hold this mike in my hand!

54. I'VE TAUGHT ALL OF OUR VIDEO INTERVIEWERS TO BE SURE & HOLD THE MIKE IN THEIR HAND so that they can talk in it when they're talking & hand it to the interviewer when they're talking. And here

I am, they harnessed me with a bunch of microphones & I'm all wired for sound & strung up & almost hamstrung--that's something else, somebody else can explain to you what that means--then I can't even hand you the microphone because they've got it attached to me! So I think I ought to hold the microphone in my hand so I can let David talk in it once in awhile. Don't you think so, David? (David: Yes!) Very good!

55. WE'VE GOT TO SET THEM A GOOD EXAMPLE THAT THIS IS THE WAY TO DO YOUR INTERVIEWS WHEN YOU'RE ON VIDEO, ON TELEVISION! The interviewer takes the microphone when he's talking & what does he do with it when he's not talking? (David: Hands it to the other guy.) And who's the other guy tonight? (David: Me!) Ha! That's right! You're the other guy! All right, I almost forgot to take the mike back again. Well, we'll call this young man Jim Dandy because in those days a very fastidious, immaculate, well-dressed, fancily-dressed young man was called a Dandy.

56. SO JIM DANDY CAME INTO MR. TYNDELL'S MEETING & HE WALKED IN-- we have another name for 'm nowadays--with his little cane & his little hat & he took it off & tipped it to the ladies & he sat down on the bench. First he took out his handkerchief & he dusted off the seat to make sure it was nice & clean, & then he took off his hat & laid it on the seat. Then he dusted off another seat to make it nice & clean & he sat his nice little self down on it. But first of all he made sure to pull up his pants just so, so he wouldn't spoil the crease. You know, when you've got your pants all nice & creased you must pull them up a little bit so that your knee doesn't get tight in 'm like that, like mine are, & get great big baggy pants-bulges there!

57. I'M SURE THIS IS GOING TO MAKE A LOT OF CRINKLY NOISES & EVERYTHING BECAUSE OF THIS DAMNED PAPER ON HERE! Why do we have to use a microphone like this, Beloved, when we're making a video? You know, we can go to thousands of dollars of expenses & get all this equipment & get me on film & David here--& we're priceless, I mean, you couldn't pay us enough--& then we try to save money by wrapping Scotch tape around the microphone so that it makes so much racket that you can't even hear what I'm saying! Praise God! Hallelujah! It looks horrible too, don't you think so?

58. WELL, GOD BLESS OUR DEAR LITTLE FOLKS HERE, THEY'RE TRYING TO SAVE MONEY & SAVE

MICROPHONES, & we go through microphones & taperecorders like nobody's business the way we wear them out! So they're trying to salvage this one. This is a poor saved soul! But instead of like Jesus saves souls where He makes them all completely new & even better than they were before, this is the way the Devil tries to get souls saved. He just sort of patches them up & wraps them up with a little paper, & tissue paper at that, & kind of glues them & tries to stick 'm together & of course they don't last very long that way, do they?

59. THAT'S THE DEVIL'S KIND OF SALVATION, TAKE A GOOD LOOK AT THAT! Patched up, glued together, wrapped around a little bit! This is the way the Devil tries to save you, & you won't last very long that way, will you? You make a lot of noises & scratchy noises & unpleasant noises instead of nice clean pure praise noises. So our dear folks are trying to save this microphone, but I'm afraid it's almost beyond salvation!

60. BUT HERE'S WHAT JESUS DOES! He doesn't just take an old patchy microphone & try to patch it up like this. What does He do? Hallelujah! He makes you a new creature in Christ Jesus! Let's get rid of this old thing & you take care of this poor half-saved soul. He gives you a nice new body. The Lord, instead of trying to patch you up, He makes you a completely new creature, amen? A whole new creature! How are you feeling, Maria? (Maria: Better I think.) Under Communism do you feel a little bit better now? TYJ!

61. THERE WE ARE! THERE'S HOW WE LOOK AFTER JESUS SAVES US! Not the patchwork of the Devil but the nice clean brand new beautiful Salvation of Jesus! See, look at the difference! You show 'm David. (David: This is how the Devil does it, & then Jesus comes & takes & makes it a new creature!) That's right!

62. DO YOU WANT TO BE PATCHED UP BY THE KIND OF RELIGION THE DEVIL HAS who tries to patch you up & cover you up & cover your sins & kind of tie you together & stick you together & glue you together a little bit until you look like this old patched up worn-out microphone?

63--OR DO YOU WANT TO BE A NICE NEW CREATURE IN CHRIST JESUS like that, all brand-new & pretty & shiny & all clean & completely saved & functioning well so we can use this & be an instrument for the Lord, like this microphone, where you can receive the Word & give it out! That's what this microphone is doing right now, it's re-

ceiving the Word & it's giving it out & it's putting it on this video so you folks out there can hear it! All right! Now we've got a nice saved microphone, not an old patched-up microphone! TYL: Now where were we, anyhow?

64. WELL, JIM DANDY WAS COMING IN, DUSTING OFF THE SEATS, SITTING DOWN, fixing his pants like this & sat down. He made sure he pulled his coat tails out from under him so they wouldn't get wrinkled & he put them back like this & he sat his hat tenderly on the seat beside him. He kept his handkerchief in his hand all the time so he could, you know, sort of wipe the sweat from his brow & could keep his moustache properly waxed.

65. HE SAT THERE WITH HIS CANE-- give me that fancy-looking cane out there & I'll show you how he sat! Ah there! I don't know whose fancy cane this one is, but anyhow, he had his nice little cane there & so he put his dainty little cane on his dainty little cane & he rested his dainty little chin on his dainty little hand & he listened to the preacher preach.

66. THEN FINALLY THE INVITATION CAME & THE PREACHER KEPT LOOKING AT HIM KIND OF STRANGE. Not many people like that came into a tent meeting for salvation! The rich, you know, & the well-dressed, they don't think they need any salvation. Jesus said that he came not to save the righteous but sinners, & the well have no need of a physician. (Mt. 9:12-13.) The rich think they're well, they think they're righteous, so he thought he was very nice & neat & clean & looked much better than all the rest of these other dirty bums & harlots & sinners & drunks & so on. But he wanted to see what this strange thing called a revival is all about.

67. SO HE HEARD THE MESSAGE & BY & BY AT THE END OF THE MESSAGE THE PREACHER INVITED THE PEOPLE TO COME FORWARD & RECEIVE JESUS, come down to the altar. They had an old-fashioned altar in those days. I don't know whether you've ever been to a revival meeting, tent meeting, tabernacle meeting. In the old-fashioned revival meetings they would come down & kneel down front. Sometimes just at the front bench or the front altar-rail or at the edge of the platform or at the preacher's feet somewhere, & pray & receive Jesus.

68. SO HE SAW EVERYBODY GOING DOWN & HE looked around & pretty soon he was almost sitting by himself. So he was a bit embarrassed so he picked up his little cane in his little hankie & he looked a little

bit at his hat, hoped it would be safe when he got back, & he pranced down to the altar. He put down his little cane & he pulled up his little pants so nice like this & then he laid down his little handkerchief like that so he could kneel down & wouldn't get his nice trousers dirty, & he leaned upon his dainty little chin upon his dainty little hand upon his dainty little cane & he had a dainty little expression as he prayed to receive Jesus.

69. THEN HE SAW EVERYBODY ELSE AROUND HIM GETTING UP, SO HE THOUGHT, "OH, I GUESS IT'S TIME TO GET UP!" OK, let's get up now. Are my pants all right? I guess this is why I wore my trousers tonight instead of my robe. At home I usually wear just my bathrobe around, it's more comfortable. But this was to illustrate. So he got up, he dusted off his dainty little pants & he took his dainty little cane & he prised back to his dainty little seat again & he sat down.

70. AND THE EVANGELIST SAID, "MY GOOD MAN, DID YOU GET IT?" They used to talk that way about getting Salvation. Did you get it? Did you get the blessing? Did you get saved? Did you get Jesus? Did you get the Holy Spirit? He said to the young fella, "Did you get it?" "Oh, yes, Sir! I got it!" And the evangelist looked at him & said, "Well, dear man, if you got it, you got it the nicest of anybody I ever saw!"

71. (DAVID: AND SO WHAT HAPPENED TO HIS HAT?) Well, fortunately when he got back there it was still there. Nobody had sat on it. And he picked up his dainty little cane & his dainty little hankie & he went back & picked up his dainty little hat & put it on his dainty little head & he daintily pranced out of the meetings! He got it! He didn't know what he got, but anyway, he got it the nicest of anybody he'd ever seen! Well, all that to say this--All that we can get out of a handkerchief!

72. WHAT IS IT THAT A RICHMAN PUTS IN HIS POCKET BUT A POORMAN THROWS AWAY? (David: A handkerchief.) Well, if this was a handkerchief... (blows nose) the richman is certainly not going to throw away his handkerchief, is he? Huh? Nice beautiful damask or linen, probably embossed or embroidered handkerchief. The men used to carry beautiful lace handkerchiefs back in the days of, oh, it's only been 100 or 200 years ago when men used to carry lovely lace handkerchiefs, flowery lace handkerchiefs in the courts of Eng-

land & France etc. They were really so dainty & nice! Men were very dainty in those days, they had a lot of those things around in those days, I guess, that are so dainty.

73. SO THE RICHMAN BLOWS HIS NOSE IN A HANKERCHIEF & HE PUTS IT IN HIS POCKET. DOESN'T HE? (David: Yes.) Well, the poorman, he doesn't have a handkerchief & the day was when they couldn't even afford tissues! So how did he blow his nose? Do you know, David? Well, I'll admit there were some little boys I knew including me who used to wipe their nose on their sleeve, but do you know how the Empress of Austria cured that? (David: No.)

74. DID YOU EVER NOTICE THAT ROW OF BUTTONS THEY USED TO HAVE ON THE EDGE OF YOUR COAT HERE that didn't seem to do anything? They didn't fasten anything, they weren't for any purpose whatsoever, just a row of buttons. Well, that was because the Empress of Austria came out one day & noticed her soldier, guard, standing in his little guardhouse trying to guard the palace, & apparently didn't have a handkerchief. Maybe he was too poor, maybe they didn't pay him enough, & his nose was dripping with a cold & he kept wiping his nose on his sleeve!

75. AND THE EMPRESS WAS HORRIFIED! SO SHE COMMANDED THAT EVERY SOLDIER IN THE ARMY HAVE EIGHT BUTTONS SEWED RIGHT ALONG HERE ON THE SLEEVE where they would be tempted to rub their noses & wipe their noses, so they couldn't wipe their noses on their sleeve anymore! Isn't that sad? It was such a nice handy place to wipe your nose when I was a little boy! (David: Yes, I think that too.) Ha! Well now, you wouldn't want all the little boys out there to learn that bad habit, would you? Or the little girls, either, of wiping their nose on their sleeves? (David: No.)

76. WELL, THEN THERE'S ONE OTHER THING YOU CAN DO IF YOU HAVEN'T GOT A HANKERCHIEF & YOU HAVEN'T GOT A TISSUE. Does anybody know? Have you ever seen a poorman blow his nose? Watch Sue there now, watch how she does it & you show the camera people how to do it. That's right. The poorman does it this way! Does he use a handkerchief? Does he use a tissue?--No! He goes like that! I've seen my Daddy do that! Blow his nose that way. Just like that! If you blow hard enough it just goes shootin' out & lands on the ground! It went out like that & if a little bit was left stringing he'd just go like that! Or maybe on his sleeve like that!

77. SO NOW THE ANSWER OF THE CONUNDRUM, THE PUZZLE, THE PROBLEM THAT WE WERE GIVING YOU, is what is it that a richman puts in his pocket & a poorman throws away? (David: A handkerchief.) But the poorman didn't have a handkerchief. What did he throw away? (David: A tissue.) He didn't have a tissue! What did he throw away when he went like this? (David: Snot.) Say it louder! (David: Snot!) Snot! That's right! Say it again. (David: SNOT!) It was snot! Yes, it was, it was not snot, yes it was snot. Not snot! Yes snot! It's not! But it is! What was it? (David: Snot!) Yes, but it is. (David: Snot!) He says it's not, I say it is!

78. ANYWAY, HOW DID I EVER GET ON THAT STORY? (Dora: Your glasses!) You never would have known why all those buttons were there if I hadn't told that story! (David: I never knew either.) I was playing on words there, Honey. You said it was snot & I said it's not. You said it's not, I say it is. You said it's snot, I said it is! You get the point now? (David: No.) You said it's not, snot, & I said yes it is! OK! All right. Maybe we gave the kids a little fun, maybe the adults too got a laugh out of that, huh? They sure were laughing here! You heard'm!

79. SO ALL THAT TO TELL YOU WHAT THE POORMAN THROWS AWAY! So what did the poorman throw away? (David: Snot.) That's right, snot! And the richman put the snot back in his pocket. What did the richman put in his pocket? (David: Snot!) The richman put snot in his pocket. And another name for it, what is it when they come out big & hard? What do you call those? (David: Buggers.) Buggers! He's got the right name. Buggers!

80. DID YOU EVER HAVE ANY BUGGERS? (David: Yes.) Well, you know Daddy, he likes to clean his nose with his fingers. (David: Yes, I do too. I do too!) (David: I do too!) But you know, you shouldn't really do that in public. Now, if you're home alone, maybe you can go mining buggers like that & going in & pulling out the long ones! But if you're out in public you musn't do that, you must cover it up like Daddy does. I pretend I'm doing it with my handkerchief but I sneak my little finger around here behind the hankie & I'm working away like this, see? I do that in public because, you know, it's not polite to show them that you're mining buggers, that you're digging for buggers!

81. SO IN PUBLIC I TAKE A NICE LITTLE HANKERCHIEF OR A TISSUE & I PUT IT IN

FRONT OF MY NOSE & I get my finger--this finger here is the best one because it fits better--goes up further inside your nose. And get that around like this & right up the nose & nobody can tell what you're doing. And then because it takes usually two fingers to pull'm out, you've got to have a finger & a thumb, you just keep the hankie up there & you keep working on it like this & you bring your thumb around like this until you pull it out like that! Oh excuse me! I didn't keep my finger up there, & you pull the buggers out like that! See? And then you wipe them nicely on your handkerchief & you fold up your handkerchief & smile at everybody & fold it up nicely & put it back in your pocket. And they figure you were just cleaning your nose with your handkerchief & all the time your hand was busy behind the hankie working away picking your nose!

82. THAT'S ONE OF DAD'S FAVOURITE OCCUPATIONS IS CLEANING MY NOSE. Because when I was a young boy in high school I broke my nose boxing & they said they could never get it very straight again, & as you can see, they never got it straight. I went to the doctor & he went "crunch!" & he said, "Is that straight? Look in the mirror!" "Oh no!" "Crunch!" & it went back this way! "Is that straight?" Meanwhile the blood was pouring out of my nose! I could hardly see by that time, "Is it straight?" And my brother was there, he says, "I think maybe one more shove'll do it!" So he said, "OK, crunch!" I ke that & you can see what happened to it! It's real crooked, isn't it, huh? (David: Yes) Very crooked.

83. (SARA: IT'S A NICE NOSE, WE LIKE IT.) Listen to all these nice people who love me, they think it's a nice nose! Well, the fact of the matter is, that's a good excuse for having a real crooked nose. But anyhow, it's a little difficult for me to breathe through because I got it broken, especially through this side, it kind of closed that side up.

84. SO I DON'T DARE HAVE ANY BUGGERS IN THERE, or any snot or I can't even breathe at all! So I have to keep cleaning it out & cleaning it out with my fingers, & every now & then probably when I'm on camera you see me scratching my nose, & excuse me, maybe I'll wipe it off a little bit down here. (David: That's what I do sometimes.) But you shouldn't do that! You shouldn't do that, should you? (David: That's what I do.) (Davida: Even when we're watching video, I pick my nose.)

85. WELL, IT'S ALL RIGHT IF YOU WANT TO PICK YOUR NOSE WHILE YOU'RE WATCHING VIDEO, BUT DON'T PICK YOUR NOSE WHILE YOU'RE ON VIDEO. OK? Because the whole world doesn't want to watch you pick your nose! It's not a very pleasant thing to be watching people pulling snot & buggers out of their nose, is it? (Family: No.) So use a tissue or a handkerchief, right? (David: Yes.) That's what you should do.

86. NOW IF YOU'RE AT HOME ALONE & NOBODY IS LOOKING, THEN YOU CAN WORK AWAY ON IT & GET RID OF IT. But be sure Mommy's not looking & Daddy's not looking, or I'm apt to give you what Paddy gave the drum! What did he give the drum? (David: A beatin'.) That's right, a beatin'! Ha! Well, of course, we don't give our children beatings, but anyhow, that's what my Mommy used to warn me with. She used to say, "You do that again & I'm going to give you what Paddy gave the drum." (David: A beatin'!) Yes, but don't beat the mike, poor Alfred's earphone's going to fall off! Ha!

87. ALL RIGHT, WHAT HAPPENED TO DANIEL 11, ANYWAY? We must be on Daniel 12 by this time? Now, next time you'll know better, to get my glasses & clean'm before we get into such stories! Huh? Now I don't even know where my glasses are! Here they are! OK! PTL! Hallelujah! Here are the glasses. David, you hang onto the mike a minute & I'll show you how to clean your glasses. Now hold it over here close enough so they can get the instructions how to clean your glasses with nary a tissue nor a hankie nor a shirt-tail!

88. MY DEAR MOTHER ONE TIME WAS IN THE RED CROSS DRUGSTORE DOWN ON FLAGLER STREET, the main street of Miami, & she was at the prescription department standing there trying to read the labels on some bottles & packages & she couldn't quite see'm very good. She was getting old like me, so she pulled out her glasses & she discovered they were a little bit dirty. Let's show'm how she did it, David. All right, David, stand up, now turn around like this. Look at this gorgeous shirt he has on, would ya? Wow! This embroidered shirt or what do you call that? Boy, your girlfriend could use the Braille system, huh? Yes!

89. WELL, ANYHOW, THE PHARMACIST WAS STANDING THERE, & you know, they wear a shirt that hangs out like this. You don't mind if I pull your shirt out do you, Son? OK? I'm sorry, did I tickle you? They wear a shirt that hangs out like that, see? And he was standing there & Grandmother was

absent-minded, looking at her glasses, "My, they really are dirty! I'll have to clean my glasses". And pretty soon the man looked around--look around David--he looked around like this & says, "Are you through, Madame?" And she said, "Oh, I'm so sorry! I didn't realise what I was doing! My glasses were dirty & I just was looking for something to clean them with!"

90. THIS KIND OF A SHIRT, BY THE WAY, IS A FANCY CUBAN SHIRT! They wear these in the Tropics & in South America where everybody's going! He's getting all ready for South America, see? In the Tropics & the Caribbean & Latin America & Cuba they wear what they call the Cuban shirt or the Latin American shirt. And see, it's not made like other shirts with the long front & long back & high sides & nothing fancy, this kind of shirt is made to wear outside of your pants like that.

91. IT'S NOT MADE TO HIDE HALF OF IT UNDERNEATH YOUR PANTS, IT'S MADE TO HANG DOWN OUTSIDE, NICE & NEAT. See, it's level all the way around. You just leave your shirt hanging out like that. Doesn't that look nice? That's Cuban style, Mexican style, Latin American style, Caribbean style! Isn't it, Folks? You folks in Latin America, isn't that the way you wear shirts?

92. AND ANOTHER REASON FOR THAT, YOU KNOW WHY? BECAUSE IT'S HOT COUNTRY & you can't stand to have your shirt inside your belt, you wear it outside your pants & then you get lots of nice air up here like this. (David squeals!) What's the matter? What's the trouble? All I was showing was the air comes creeping up like this! All right, David, if you can't stand the air to creep up your shirt-tail, I guess we'll have to stop that illustration!

93. THAT WAS TOTALLY UNPLANNED, UNREHEARSED & UNEXPECTED! I was just trying to find my glasses & clean'm, that's all, & I was looking around for something to clean them with! And then I got off into handkerchiefs & Jim Dandies & shirt-tails! Will we ever get to the Bible story? Well, I don't know how many nights this beautiful beautiful assistant has been sitting over here waiting to assist me & bring on the props, I mean, the flannelgraphs, to help us with our story, & so far she's brought two on & only got to Daniel 11 & 12, it's about the Antichrist & he's going to come in peaceably & obtain the kingdom by flatteries & be strong with a small people!

94. WE WEREN'T PLANNING A COMEDY TONIGHT, FOLKS, IT JUST HAPPENED THAT WAY! It was

an accident! Maybe that's for the children. OK! Oh, I finally got my glasses! That's where the whole trouble started, so Daddy could see with his glasses! Hallelujah! TYL! PTL!

95. WELL, NOW LET'S SEE WHICH OF OUR PRETTY LITTLE GIRLS IS MY SCRIPTURE REFERENCE TONIGHT? No, that's Marianne & she takes care of John. And that one is Milcah & she takes care of Luke. And in case you haven't seen these pretty ones before, that's pretty Unity, she takes care of one of the Saints, she takes care of Saint Mark! And that's pretty Melody & right now she's taking care of Saint Matthew. You know, just like you girls take care of us boys, OK? (Nude pix in his Bible!)

96. AND THIS PRETTY GIRL, JOANNA, SHE'S TAKING CARE OF OUR PROPHECY DANIEL FOR TONIGHT, A REAL FEER! Amen? Isn't that pretty? Isn't she beautiful? Actually she takes care of Beriah & her hubby Abraham, & this photo was by her hubby. X! I like to kiss her--XX--both places! All right, here we have Daniel! Anyhow this is a real fun church, huh? You don't go to sleep here, do you? You don't fall off the bench & you don't wonder, wish he'd hurry up so you could go home & get out in the ball-park & play baseball on Sunday afternoon. (Family: No!) You like to study the Bible, don't you? (Family: Yes!) OK! And we have fun on the way.

97. IT ONLY TOOK US AN HOUR TO GET TO THE TEXT! Now we read a little text, & maybe in one more hour we'll get to the message! I promised I was only going to take half-a-tape tonight, an hour-&-a-half. How far along are we? Who's our tape monitor? How much tape are we on? Because I don't want to keep these poor folks out there, look how sleepy they are! Look how tired they are! We don't want to keep them awake all night. (James: About half.) So we're all done, huh? Well, we haven't even started the Bible Study yet, how can we be all done?

98. WE'RE HALFWAY THROUGH THE TAPE THAT'S WHERE I PLANNED TO QUIT TONIGHT! You guys want to go on? (Sara: Yes, we want to go on!) You mean you want to go on? We've already been on an hour-&-a-half. (Family: Let's keep going.) Well, the first half-hour was Tech & David's show. (David: I'd like to stay till one o'clock!) Say that again, Son, here's one of my most loyal fans! You want to stay till when? (David: One o'clock!) He wants to stay till one o'clock! And what time is it right now by that clock? (David: Half-past-ten!) Very good! He can tell time! How's that?

the Word! And she's got wings of song, maybe, & she's got the Truth girt about her here & she's shod with the Gospel of Peace & she's all ready to do what?--To go out FFing, of course! Right? She's all ready to go out & fight the battle of the Lord with the Devil right on his territory & save men for Jesus! Right? Doesn't that sound like FFing? OK: That's FFing!

116. SO THERE'S OUR BEAUTIFUL NEW MAGAZINE (No. 34) that's come out now for our first Magazine of the Month of February, this our Anniversary Month, arrived now just today on our Anniversary Day of the 18th of February, our Family Birthday, 1981! Isn't that beautiful? (Family: Yes!) TYJ: And it's just loaded with all kinds of beautiful pictures! Oh my! I don't even have time to show you all these beautiful pictures, but I might happen to run across a few of those beautiful pictures that I noticed in here, & probably the postman will notice too if he opens the package! They put 'm so nicely placed where they're right out where he can really see 'm & enjoy 'm!

117. LET'S SEE HERE, THERE ARE QUITE A FEW PRETTY PICTURES THAT YOU OUGHT TO SEE! My, there're so many, there's one almost every page here. There's a pretty picture of a mother & a baby. And look at that pretty picture there on page 45! (Maria: Show them 26 & 28.) Look at 30! Forget about 26 & 28! Wow! Dave, did you see those pictures on page 30? Whoooo! And there's 28, & you forgot 29, it's kind of small but it's very pretty. (David: She's like Mama Sara!) Oh, she's pretty like Mama Sara: Yes, that's another one of our girls, Mama Sara. We've got lots of mothers around here! Did you see that one on page 28? And did you see page 26? (Family: Wow!)

118. WHAT IN THE WORLD IS THAT, DAVID? (Shows David picture on Page 26.) What's happening? What am I doing? Where am I? Where's my head? Right there! Where're my arms? Right there! Where're my hands? Doing what I was doing tonight, getting my hands warm! I'm just getting my hands warm, right? So what have I got my hands on? (David: Nips!) Two hot potatoes! Nips, oh my! To what have we now descended? From beautiful bosoms we go to breasts & then titties, & then nipples, & then finally it's down to nips! Oh my, well nipples is easier for her to say. They're so beautiful, I see a couple of gorgeous ones right now.

119. I'M WARMING MY HANDS ON A COUPLE OF

NICE BOSOMS, RIGHT? Bosoms sounds so nice & delicious & luscious & squeeze & nice & lovely! (David: Do you want to make some?) You want to make some? Right now? Right here? In front of the camera? (David: Yes!) Some love? Oh my! This girl is getting there fast! Well, where is she sitting? (David: I can't tell. On a perlie!) Oh, my goodness. Shhh! You're not supposed to use these words on camera, it's against the censorship! She's sitting on Grandpa! (David: I thought they were fucking, actually fucking an angel!) We're not supposed to use that word on the camera, but you heard it--but you didn't hear it--anyhow, it's an angel!

120. SO ANYHOW, DON'T WE HAVE PRETTY PICTURES IN OUR MAGAZINE? Oh my! And look at these pretty girls on page 25. Did you see them? Oh, that's almost more than his share of pretty girls, isn't it? Isn't that lovely? (Maria: What do you think about threesomes, by the way?) Oh I think threesomes are wonderful! I think foursomes & fivesomes are even better! So anyway, we have a lot of pretty pictures in our Magazine. The girls send me all their pretty pictures & I certainly don't want them to go to waste!

121. I PUT THEM UP ON MY WALLS & MY DESK & MY BRIEFCASE & EVERYWHERE I CAN FIND A PLACE TO STICK 'M, & I don't have enough places to put 'm all up! So I have to send some of them to the FN Magazine! So I try to pick out the prettiest ones & send to the FN. Well, the pretty ones that I can do without, at least, some of them I can't do without, I've got to keep them. Because I love the girls so much I wouldn't dare take them off my desk!

122. SOME OF YOU, IF YOUR PICTURE DOESN'T GET IN THE FN MAGAZINES, it's because it's so near to my heart or my bed or my desk that I can't give it up. Right, Maria? (Maria: And some of them are so dear to you that you want to share them with the whole World!) And some of them are so dear to me I want to share 'm with the whole Family! She's trying to talk me into parting with some of my pretty pictures.

123. SO THERE'S THAT BEAUTIFUL MAGAZINE! Which do you like best, the top half or the bottom half? I think they're both pretty nice. And it doesn't even have a title on it, which makes it kind of incognito! You can read it selah on the bus or the train & they won't even know what you're reading as you go through the Magazine! Beautiful Magazine!

124. EACH MAGAZINE WILL COME OUT FROM NOW

ON TWICE A MONTH, God willing, on the 1st & 15th, & it'll have a LIN in one & a KIDZ in the other. A 220-page Magazine every couple of weeks, twice a month! That's 440 pages a month, bigger than a paperback novel or a big novel! Most novels are only around 300 pages. (Maria: Actually, adding on, it would be more than 440 pages. It'd be 440 plus 64.) Doesn't the 220 pages include the LIN? (Maria: No.) It doesn't anymore? I thought it included them! My oh my oh my! (1981.)

125. YOU MEAN TO TELL ME THAT WE HAVE A 220-PAGE MAGAZINE PLUS A 32-PAGE LIN OR A 32-PAGE KIDZ MAGAZINE? 252 PAGES of Magazine in every package that you get at your Homes? 252 pages! 504 pages a month? That's almost too much Magazine, huh? Well, we're doing that this month & maybe next month to kind of catch up, because we got so far behind, we got so much material for the Magazine that we can't get it all in, so we had to put out two Magazines in one month.

126. NORMALLY YOU'RE NOT SUPPOSED TO GET MORE THAN ABOUT ONE MAGAZINE A MONTH THAT BIG, 252 pages all together. That really ought to be enough, don't you think? That's about all I can read in one month & I don't see how you can read any more! I read every word of it & it takes me all month to do it! So I'm thinking that you're going to have to save some of these if you can't manage to read the whole thing at once. Maybe for some month when we're on the run hidin' or movin' or something & we can't put out a Magazine, you'll have to save that extra Magazine for that extra month. But anyhow, there's our new Magazine!

127. AND DO YOU KNOW WHAT I FOUND OUT? In our New Year's Eve Program we told you all about the Family stats etc., but there're some stats that I forgot to give you! Guess what? I keep a record, you know, of my work, of every page that I do & of all the pages that I have to read--the MQ Letters & the FN News & the WN's. (Yawns!) Excuse me! It's late, it's 11:30! It's not the company, it's the hour! I think I'm going to start keeping track of how many newspapers I have to read, all those pages that I have to read every month & all year long. My oh my, I forgot to count them in! And also reports & all kinds of things.

128. I READ WAY OVER 3,000 PAGES A YEAR, that amounts to something like nine pages a day, believe it or not. I forgot the exact figure & forgot to bring it with me,

but it's over 3,000-something a year--This past year of 1981 from February last through this past January. And that doesn't count how many times I read 'm either.

129. WHEN IT'S A MQ LETTER, THE FIRST TIME I GO OVER IT IS WHEN I FIRST DICTATE IT or tell the story or the dream or whatever it is on tape, that's once, then I get it back in rough draft & I edit it, that's twice. Then I get back the final typing & I proofread it, that's three times. Then we get it back corrected, final corrections, that's four times! Then we get it back finally laid out with the art & everything & look it over & that's five times!

130. SO EVERY MQ LETTER THAT YOU SEE IN THIS MAGAZINE, I'VE BEEN OVER IT AT LEAST FOUR OR FIVE TIMES, unless somebody else has edited it for me, & then I've been over it at least three or four times in order to get it in good shape for you to read so you'll be able to understand it, & punctuate it so you won't get confused, & properly spelled & try to straighten out all my bad grammar, or sometimes our Family's bad grammar, at least so we can all speak the same thing & the same language, at least have the same meaning! PTL!

131. SO THERE'S OUR NEW MAGAZINE THAT'S COMING OUT THIS MONTH & there'll be another one out this month, God willing, trying to catch up on our big backlog, because we got out so many other publications during the last three months. We got out a full Komix Magazine, we got out a colour calendar, we got out a Daily Might book, we got out so many different other things that we didn't even have a chance to get out some Magazine for about a month or so. So now you're going to see again the Magazines, & be sure that you don't forget to read 'm!

132. ONE POOR SAD LITTLE FAMILY, THEY GOT THE MAGAZINE THAT WE HAD THE STORY IN ABOUT "WATCH YOUR WATTS", about watch out about your electricity, that you don't use a heater that's stronger than the current that you have, that it could blow your fuses or your breaker switch. And of course if you don't have a fuse or breaker switch, it burns up your wires & whatever they're attached to, like a house or a trailer, caravan or a tent!

133. AND THIS POOR PRECIOUS LITTLE FAMILY WENT OFF & LEFT THEIR CHILDREN, about five or six children sleeping in this little trailer. You know, one of those little trailers that opens up to a big tent? Because they'd all gone to see a movie ex-

cept one person. And when they came back they didn't want to move the children because they were all sound asleep so they left them sleeping in the tent with an electric heater on that was too strong for the current & the poor wiring & the poor socket outlet & the cushion that was over the socket. It got too hot, it caught fire, it burned & it caught the trailer on fire!

134. AND THANK GOD THEY HEARD THE CHILDREN JUST IN TIME to wake them up & they got out there & got most of the children out. But two of them went to be with the Lord because they didn't get 'em out soon enough. All because of not watching their watts! Do you know they had received that Magazine just a few days before that happened & said they had been too busy to read it all!

135. THEY SAID, "WE SEE NOW THE VALUE OF READING THE WHOLE MAGAZINE TOGETHER, OF US, TO MAKE SURE WE READ IT ALL!" I guess they'd skipped around & just read what they were interested in, & they said, "Oh, 'Watch Your Watts'? What are watts? Who cares about watts? Why should we have to watch watts?" And because they didn't read & pay attention to the warnings, two of their children died, went to be with Jesus, burned in the trailer!

136. LET ME TELL YOU, BELOVED, I WROTE A NOTICE THEM IN THE MAGAZINE. I said, "Remember, I warned you in the first three chapters on caravans. I talked about almost nothing but fire & the danger of fire & watching your watts!" I talked about that in "Watch Your Watts" etc. I said electricity is fire & it can catch things on fire. It can burn down your house or your trailer or your tent or even you if you're careless!

137. AND LET ME TELL YOU, YOU'D BETTER WATCH YOUR WATTS & your fires & your electricity & your cords & plugs & heaters & all! And when you have an electric heater going, you'd better be sure it's not too strong or powerful & that it's plugged into a good receptacle, a good socket that's strong enough to carry the heavy current, & good wiring that's strong enough.

138. AND IF YOU FEEL ALONG THE CORD & YOU FEEL THE PLUG OR THE SOCKET GETTING HOT, & much worse, the wires getting hot, you'd better turn it off quick & unplug it & not use it on that circuit any more! Because electricity is fire, & if the fire gets too big for the wires & the socket & the plug, they will catch fire! (David: And it bursts out, poof!) And it'll burn down

your house or your trailer or your tent & your children. They lost two children, isn't that sad? So watch your watts!

139. THEY DIDN'T READ THE MAGAZINE SOON ENOUGH & THEY DIDN'T READ THAT PART THEY NEEDED TO READ. And they must have forgotten about all the chapters I wrote about fires, because I warned you that one of the greatest hazards & dangers of camping out or caravanning is fire. You must watch out for fire! They were not careful, they were careless, neglectful, negligent & the electricity caught the little trailer on fire, 'cause they thought they had to have a heater in there for the children all night.

140. BUT YOU DON'T NEED A HEATER IF YOU WRAP YOUR CHILDREN UP REAL GOOD IN NICE DOWNY WARM WOOLLEN SLEEPING BAGS ETC! I don't know about the polyester, that stuff almost explodes & goes up in smoke! But I'm convinced to use the old-fashioned woollen woollies & cottons & down & things like that, because the kind of clothes the Lord made don't explode! The kind of fabrics that God intended you to use for clothing and blankets don't explode like all these synthetics that catch fire and go boom, like that, and also gas you to death with the poisonous fumes!

141. WOOL & COTTON & FLAX & LINEN & THINGS LIKE THAT DON'T CATCH FIRE SO EASILY & they don't burn so rapidly, & they don't let off poisonous fumes like synthetic fabrics, so they won't kill you like these synthetics do. But they were in synthetic sleeping bags which almost exploded & it was terrible! And they lost two precious little lives, two small children, one two & one three, that couldn't get out of the trailer soon enough. The older children managed to get out but the two youngest ones died in the fire or a little bit afterward & went to be with Jesus. Well, thank God they went to be with the Lord!

142. THINK ABOUT HOW PRECIOUS THOSE LITTLE LIVES ARE & HOW MUCH WORK WE'VE SPENT ON THEM & how much work it was for the dear mother to bring them into this World, & then all the training, two or three years of training & teaching them to talk & potty-train & dress themselves, all the other things that you've taught them about Jesus & all the rest. Thank God they were two & three, so I guess they both had received the Lord & knew Jesus. In fact, I understand that they talked to them about Jesus as they were dying etc. & that they said that they hurt

so bad that they prayed that the Lord would heal them right away or He'd take them & He took them, PTL!

143. SO WE WANT TO TAKE GOOD CARE OF OUR CHILDREN & WE WANT TO WATCH OUR WATTS & watch our lights & our fires & our stairways & our vehicles & all kinds of things that could cause accidents. Sharp objects, hard floors where they could fall, we need to be very very cautious to take care of these precious little lives. We've gone to all that trouble & the Lord's given them to us, the most precious thing He can give us, & then we're careless! We don't take good care of them & He has to take them back again.

144. THAT'S SAD, ISN'T IT? WHEN THEY MIGHT HAVE BEEN USEFUL WITNESSES & LITNESSERS & WON PEOPLE TO JESUS & told people about the Lord & been a big help in the Army of the Lord, right? But they lost two little soldiers by carelessly letting them sleep in a trailer that wasn't watched by an adult, no adult sleeping with them, no adult in the trailer with them, think of that!

145. AND ALSO TABITA & TIAGO, OUR PRECIOUS VS'S IN BRAZIL—we don't yet know how it happened, we haven't had the story, but their little toddler apparently toddled off unwatched, uncared for, out of sight, toddled into the swimming pool & drowned! Another child! (Maria: A few months ago we had another one too.) How can people let a little toddler out of their sight? I don't see how they can let them out of their sight when they know they're going to toddle off, especially when there's water nearby or a swimming pool!

146. WHAT WAS THE VERY FIRST THING I HAD THEM DO WHEN WE MOVED INTO CASA TREBOL IN TENERIFE, THAT HAD A SWIMMING POOL? We wouldn't let David even out in the yard until we did what? (Sara: Put up a fence all the way around.) We had Papa Marcos come & build a fence around the swimming pool very first thing, didn't we, David? Papa Marcos, that good ol' Grandfather there, came & built a nice fence for us, that you couldn't climb over & you couldn't get through the gate, remember? (David: No.) You can't remember that? Well, it happened anyway. You'll see it in the movies when we get 'em all on video.

147. OH MY, WE'VE GOT HUNDREDS OF FEET OF MOVIES ABOUT DAVIDITO & TENERIFE & OUR PRETTY FF GIRLS & WHEN WE WENT SKINNY-DIPPING IN THE POOL. We're going to put them all on video tape, so don't fail to get your videos! Don't forget to get the

PAL-VHS systems, though, because you won't be able to see 'em if you don't, & we'll get all those hundreds of feet of beautiful colour, & some of it sound film, put on video! We've already discovered how to do it & one of our dear photographers has already made a start, and it really works great! (Dome!—& they're beautiful! GBH!)

148. WE'RE GOING TO TRANSFER ALL OF THAT TO VIDEO FILM, because we can get hundreds & hundreds of feet of ordinary movie film on one little video cassette! On one \$20 video cassette we can get \$500 worth of colour movie film! Think of that! Don't tell me video's not a bargain when you can get on one three-hour \$20 tape, \$500 worth of colour movies that it cost us \$500 to buy to take all those pretty movies of Tenerife & our pretty FF girls swimming in the pool & sunning beside the pool & FFing their men by the pool!

149. I'LL NEVER FORGET SEEING CARLOS THERE, HE & SHE WERE LYING THERE LIKE ADAM & EVE, & he had this cute little piece of long grass & he was tickling her guess-what with a piece of grass! He wasn't smoking it, he was just tickling with it, that's all! But some of the old straight-laced long blue-nosed neighbours complained about the fact that we were going skinny-dipping!

150. DO YOU KNOW WHAT SKINNY-DIPPING IS? That's when you go swimming when you don't have any bathing suit. Well, it's not & sunny & a nice swimming pool, why not swim the way the Lord made you, without a bathing suit? And we put up a nice big screen so the neighbours weren't supposed to be able to see us, unless they sure tried awful hard to peek over that screen & around that latticework & through that rattan to try to see us out there skinny-dipping! I don't think men are particularly beautiful, but the girls were sure pretty!

151. SO IF YOU WANT TO SEE ALL THOSE BEAUTIFUL FILMS WE MADE DOWN IN GOOD OLD TENERIFE of the Family of Love & all of our beautiful FFers & their fish & Davidito when he was just a little tiny kid & David when she was just a baby & Grandpa teaching the folks there in our yard, in our Church of Love, & all the wonderful interesting pictures & movies we made in that beautiful paradise island, then be sure you've got a video with a PAL-VHS system. PAL--P-A-L!--VHS--V-H-S!--System! Nothing else will do it! You won't be able to play 'em or see 'em on any other kind of system.

152. DON'T GET THAT LOUSY BETAMAX SYSTEM

you were able out there in Videoland to share it with us, all you Family around the World: MMM is now around the World in 80 countries. They're booking about one station a day, & wait till we explode on all the Latin stations with that Spanish MMM: And we're already making the Italian MMM, Angelo & Sarah have already made a sample program & it's beautiful! And they're working on the French MMM, dear Jeremiah, Simon Black, Michael & Sunny & the folks up yonder. So we're going to have MMM's Music With Meaning radio tapes in every important language around the World!

171. AND I THINK THE NEXT BIG EXPLOSION IS GOING TO EVEN BE BIGGER THAN THE ENGLISH EXPLOSION WHEN THAT SPANISH MMM HITS THE FIELD & goes out across all Latin America & Spain & Portugal & everywhere that people speak Spanish & Portuguese! It's going to be tremendous! Dic you like it, Margie? (Margie: I loved it!) Margie is a native Spanish-speaker, I call her "mi Doña" because she looks like one of those real aristocratic Doñas of the old Spanish hacienda days when they had those great big "rancho grandes" & ladies were really ladies & gentlemen were really gentlemen! And they call them Don this & Don that.

172. DO YOU KNOW WHAT THEY USED TO CALL ME IN TENERIFE? It's a term of great respect! They used to call me Don David!—Until they found out I was even more than Don David! And then do you know what they started calling me? Padre David, because they figured I was a kind of a priest now because I talked about Jesus & religion & had all these girls preaching the Gospel to all these men in nightclubs, so they called me Padre David because I was like a priest with all these daughters. Well, not many priests have so many pretty daughters who work in nightclubs winning Fish to the Lord! So I was a kind of a revolutionary Padre! A lot of Padres would have liked to take my place!

173. AND I'M LIVING IN A REGULAR HAREM RIGHT NOW! God bless all these beautiful women that are all around me! Ahhh! These girls, they are so pretty they make my heart skip a beat, so beautiful, a'l of them! And I'm glad that we're here! (Maria: Maybe we'd better pray!) Maria says I'd better pray or I'll want too many birthday presents tonight! God bless 'em all!

174. WELL, I LOVE 'M ALL & I WAS TELLING THEM TONIGHT THEY'RE ALL MY QUEENS & THAT MARIA IS A QUEEN OF QUEENS; Remember the Lord called me a king of kings once upon

a time? Because I had a lot of kings working for me? Of course, Jesus is the King of kings, don't misunderstand me. But Jesus' Queen is the Holy Spirit, she's the Queen of Love, right? She's really the Queen of all queens. But Maria is a Queen of queens, 'cause you're all queens & she's the Queen of queens!

175. WE'VE GOT A NEW QUEEN DOWN AT MMM NOW, THE QUEEN OF MUSIC, A NEW BRUNHELD, FAITH! She's our new queen who has replaced Rachel! And isn't that something? Along the same line of work, in a way, but the kind of music work which Rachel & them perverted into hard rock, so the Lord didn't bless it & didn't use it very much. They kept trying to make hit records & they flunked on most of them & flunked out & finally they had to nearly all backslide to the Pit & back to the vomit & the mire to find out what a mess & how sickening it was, & then they got back to Jesus & the Lord's work through MMM, & now they're happy making music for Jesus! And making music for the King, too!

176. THEY CALLED THEMSELVES THE MMM MINSTRELS, but I said, "I think on the program it'd be nice to call them the King's Minstrels! After all, you're my minstrels! So that's a good name for 'em, don't you think? The King's Minstrels! The King's Musicians! You heard about that king: 'O! King Cole was a merry ol' soul & a merry ol' soul was he! I'm going to have to pray now, they tell me, or the tape's going to be finished & I want to just say goodnight to you all!

THANK YOU FOR A HAPPY BIRTHDAY & THANK EVERY ONE OF YOU THERE FOR BEING SO FAITHFUL & serving the Lord & witnessing the Gospel, litnessing, preaching the Gospel, singing the Gospel, winning souls & doing all the wonderful things you're doing which has made every birthday more worthwhile, & also for faithfully tithing, helping to support our publications work so that we can feed you the Word & give it all to you in our little Magazine & in books, we're publishing books & everything now. We never dreamed we going to ever publish so much! I dreamed we were going to ever publish so much! All we started out with was a few little one-page MO Letters typewritten by your Queen of queens own little hands when she was just a little humble nobody secretary & nobody hardly ever heard of her!

So, praise God! TYJ!

178. DO YOU WANT TO THANK THE LORD NOW FOR ALL OF THAT? Are you all thankful? (Family: Amen!) PTL! We've gotten quite a kingdom now! Hallelujah! TYJ! PTL! This is it, this is going to be the end of this tape, we're not going to do any more. We just thanked the Lord, if we're just cut off right now while we're praising the Lord, why, that's enough. We don't have to pray too hard or anything, we're just praising the Lord for a wonderful year! But we could pray for this coming year & the Lord will give us an even better year. Praise God?

179. AMEN, LORD, WE THANK YOU FOR ALL THY BLESSINGS OF THE PAST YEAR & THE GREATER BLESSINGS EACH YEAR. The Family's growing, Homes are growing & we're getting in more places & countries all the time, & we're going out by radio & television & video, & the message is getting out further than ever before! We thank You Jesus for helping us to preach the Gospel in all the World to every creature! We've just about gotten to all the World almost, Lord, we haven't quite reached every creature yet, but on radio & television we surely will, & with the Magazine & with the videos!

180. SO BLESS THEM ALL, MAKE THEM INSTRUMENTS & TOOLS OF CARRYING THY WORD, these scrolls of tape like the scrolls of ancient books, Lord. These scrolls of tape that unroll the Message to the World! Bless them & make 'em roll, Lord, in Jesus' name! Make the gold roll to the whole World to give them Thy Message of Love & Thy Gospel of Salvation until You come, Jesus! TYJ! Hallelujah!

181. KEEP US ALL SAFELY IN THY CARE! Give us all a good night's rest every night, Lord. Keep us close to You in the center of Thy will this coming year. Help us to accomplish more than ever before! Preach more, sing more, music more, litness more, witness more, win more & reach more until, Lord, we have done all we possibly can to reach the World with Thy Love! Whatever our job is, FF more, fix more, cook more, type more, clean more, whatever it is, Lord, help us to do more than we've ever done before in a coming great year, Lord, before the war comes, the night comes when no man can work! And before You come, Jesus, when our work in this life will be over! Help us, in Jesus' name! (& we did!)

182. BLESS & KEEP US ALL & MAKE US A GREAT BLESSING! Continue to make us a great blessing through out the world to many more millions, Lord! We've already

reached hundreds of millions, in fact billions of people, & won hundreds of millions to Thee, Lord. Now nearly 400 million souls that we've reached with Thy Gospel & won so many millions already! TYJ! PYL! Hallelujah!

183. WE THANK YOU JESUS, WE'VE DISTRIBUTED SO MUCH LITERATURE & WON SO MANY SOULS TO YOU! We ask Thee to keep them all & may we see them before long in Thy Heavenly Kingdom!—Either in Heaven at the Marriage Supper of the Lamb where we'll first see them, or as we're caught up together with them in the air, Lord, at Thy Rapture when You come, & certainly sooner or later in Thy Kingdom on Earth when we come back to rule the World with Thy loving rod of iron to cause the whole nations of all the World to obey Thee! Help us Lord!

184. WE'RE IN TRAINING NOW FOR THAT BIG JOB, LORD, BIGGER JOBS YET TO COME when we're going to have to really rule the World directly ourselves. Now all we have to do is try to win 'em, Lord, & You're taking care of running the World. One of these days we're going to have to help You run the World! In a way, we're doing it right now. In a way, we're helping to decide the course of nations & the fate of the World as we help people decide their own fate. As we witness the Gospel, Lord, You're going to hold them accountable, You're going to hold their cities accountable, You're going to hold their states accountable, their nations accountable.

185. YOU'RE GOING TO HOLD THE WHOLE WORLD RESPONSIBLE FOR THE GOSPEL THAT THEY HAVE HEARD THROUGH US & for the love they've received through us, Thy Children of Love, Lord! We thank Thee for that new name You've given us that incorporates both of our names Lord, that we've had before: Not only Children of God, Thy children, Lord, not only Family of Love, but Children of Love! TYJ! Hallelujah! So help us to reach as many as we can, Lord, while there's still time, before the night comes when no man can work. (Jn.9:4.) Keep us & give us the strength for the task, the wisdom, Lord, the faith, the love, the patience, the grace & all that we need, Lord, in order to do Thy work!

186. BLESS THE PRECIOUS MOTHERS OF ALL THESE PRECIOUS PRICELESS TREASURES, these little children, Lord, as they train them & as they care for them, & the fathers too. As they teach them, Lord, & as they take them out to witness & litness to preach the Gospel & serve You, Jesus.

Bless & keep them all & help all these parents to be more prayerful & careful & mindful & diligent to take better care of them so we won't lose any more, Lord! Help them not to be so careless as to let them die in fires or wander into pools, Lord, but we ask in Jesus' name to help us to preach the Gospel & finish the job before You come, in Jesus' name! Amen! PTL!

187. (MARIA: ON YOUR BIRTHDAY YOU'RE ALWAYS GIVING GIFTS TO EVERYONE ELSE, you wanted to give someone else a little birthday gift, don't you?) Yes, this is my birthday so I'm going to give a present to somebody else! Somebody gave me a present already today & this is my birthday. On David's birthday we didn't get to give him a present because it wasn't finished yet, so we're going to give it to him now on my birthday! (David: It's your birthday!) I know, I'm going to give you a present on my birthday! (David: No, it's your birthday.) Well, so what? Can't I give you a present on my birthday? (David: Yes, but it's yours.)

188. JESUS GAVE US A PRESENT ON HIS BIRTHDAY, HE GAVE US HIMSELF, DIDN'T HE? (David: Yes, & lots of bread & wine too.) Bread & wine is a part of the present, & Jesus gave us Himself on His birthday. Mary gave us a present on Jesus' birthday, didn't she? She gave us Jesus, right? So I can give you a present on my birthday. I wrote a little note on it a long time ago, David, but I don't know if you could hardly read it now. It's kind of smeared, but it says: "Happy Birthday to..." (David: David!) "With love from Mom & Dad," & I don't know what the rest of it said because it got all rubbed out! Anyhow, for your birthday on the January 25, 1981, & I'm giving it to you now on February 18th, my birthday, 1981.

189. SO THIS MAKES ME HAPPY TO GIVE YOU A PRESENT ON MY BIRTHDAY! Now would you like to open it up & see what it is? (David: Thank you.) He said thank you! Now wasn't that nice & polite? Our teachers here really teach our children to be polite! You ought to hear Techí say, "excuse me" & "thank you"! (David opens his gift.) Look at that, something you needed for a long time! You didn't have one, did you? (David: No.) What is it? (David: A ring!) Can you see it good on television? What does it say? Can you read it? It's in script. Can you see the letter on there? (David: G.) It's a D. (David: Oh, I thought it was a G.) You thought it was G for God? (David: No, I thought it was G

for Grandpa because you gave it to me!) Oh, that's sweet! Well, what's the D for? (David: Me.) D is for what word? (David: David.) That's right! Not for me, me starts with M. But David starts with D! 190. SO I THINK YOUR FIRST RING YOU'RE SUPPOSED TO PUT ON YOUR RIGHT HAND. You don't put rings on your left hand till you get engaged or married. It's a little bit big but it's just a small little gold ring, maybe we'll just put a little tape inside like we did Techí's & that'll hold it until you grow into it a little more! I'll tell you one finger it'll fit, there's a finger you can wear it on & it won't fall off! How's that?--His big thumb! Thumb man! Thumbalina! Now hold it up & show it to the camera & see if they can see it real good. Put it right there like that! Put'r there, pal! OK! PTL! Just a little tiny gold ring for David.

191. YOU SEE, HE BELIEVES WHAT DADDY PREACHES, INVEST IN GOLD! So we went out & found him this nice little gold ring & it's real gold too. Of course, it's not very big but it's big enough for David, PTL! And he's got a little ring. Nearly everybody's got some kind of rings & bracelets & watches & necklaces, & we like to keep you all prettied up, don't we? PTL! And make you look beautiful for Jesus? Keep you well adorned!

192. MY MOTHER USED TO SAY, "IF YOU CAN WEAR THINGS THAT MAKE YOU LOOK PRETTIER, well, you might as well make God's child look as pretty as possible! "--And she wore jewelry! Some churches & narrow-minded church people criticised her for it & said, "You shouldn't wear rings!" They even took off their wedding rings & said you shouldn't even wear wedding rings or watches, imagine that! They didn't wear make-up, they wore long dresses--well, that was pretty--& they did have long hair, that's nice, they didn't cut their hair, & they did it in very fancy braids on top of their head. But my Mother believed in looking pretty for Jesus!

193. SHE SAID, "OF COURSE YOUR BEST DECORATION, AS SAINT PETER SAID, YOUR GREAT ADORNMENT IS A MEEK & QUIET SPIRIT!" A meek & a humble spirit. That's the best decoration you can wear, girls. A meek & quiet spirit. (1Pe.3:4.) Isn't that beautiful? Amen? So if you have a meek & quiet spirit that really makes you beautiful! That's the best decoration you can wear. But in the meantime God doesn't mind if you wear a few little decorations if you have them & can afford them. And God can

afford them, amen?

194. SO THERE'S A LITTLE RING FOR DAVID JUST TO REMEMBER HIS BIRTHDAY! (David: Thank you for it!) Oh, you're welcome Honey. What birthday was it? (David: My sixth birthday.) He said that real clear, didn't he? It's hard to say "sixth". My sixth birthday! So God bless him, for his sixth birthday he got a golden ring. You'll find a lot of jewelry in the Bible, you just read it! Especially the Old Testament, they wore lots of jewelry, they danced, they sang, they had orchestras, they had a good time! (Yawns!) I'm getting really sleepy, I'm going to have to quit! You guys might as well stop these videos because I'm not going to be able to go any longer. (David: A kiss.) Thank you, Sweet Boy! I love you! TYJ! PTL! Hallelujah!

195. GOODNIGHT! GOD BLESS YOU ALL! HAPPY BIRTHDAY! (Sings:) "Happy Birthday to you! Happy Birthday to you! Happy Birthday dear Family! Happy Birthday to you!" See, it's all your birthday, it's the Family Birthday, not just for me alone but the whole Family! PTL! GBY all! I don't know about you, but it's after midnight & I'm tired. It's no longer my birthday, so let's go to bed, what do you say? I don't know if I've got the strength to get out of the chair & go over there & eat, but I might have the strength to eat a little cake & ice cream! (David: Oh yes please, you have the strength!) It's no fun to eat it over there, it's more fun to eat it together, isn't it?

196. (MARIA: DAVID SAID HE WANTED TO STAY TILL ONE O'CLOCK & HE'S GETTING HIS WISH!) It shows you I'm not much of a prophet, I told you I wasn't going to stay up that late, but it looks like I am! (David: Oh yes, I guess God's giving you strength.) Amen, God is giving me strength. Well, enough, enough, enough! You guys keep me up so late! I wanted to quit when the thing was half-over but you're not satisfied with one tape, you want to make another one! I'm tired!

197. WE STARTED WITH THE BREAD & THE COMMUNION & WE WOUND UP WITH CAKE & ICE CREAM! Well, that's the way things go in the Family! The kingdom of God! We started with Communion & wound up with a Birthday Party! PTL! TYSM folks for all this big treat, amen? (Kids: AMEN!) The Family's going to wonder how come I have mucha when I say I like chocolate cake! The chocolate's down there being sliced ready for the Family. So there we are!

198. AND YOU SAY, "HOW COME YOU ONLY USE

ONE CANDLE WHEN YOU'RE SUPPOSED TO BE 62?"

Well, 62 would be a terrible waste of candles, we're saving the other 61 candles for survival! We're economising & we believe in just one candle! You say, "How come you light it & you don't blow it out?" Because we believe in giving life, not extinguishing life! We believe in bringing light to the World, not darkness! So we don't believe in blowing them out, do we? We don't blow'm out anymore! We used to blow'm out but I couldn't figure it out--I thought, why should you want to blow it out? It looks so pretty! 201. I THINK I'M GOING TO GO TO SLEEP HERE ON DAVID'S SHOULDER 'CAUSE I'M SO TIRED! (David: I'll hold you up!) I'm going to go to sleep on you like the ol' Lion! (Maria: Lord bless him & help him & supernaturally strengthen him for all he's given today. In Jesus' name strengthen his heart, Lord. TYL!)

202. YOU KNOW WHAT I'D LIKE FOR A BIRTHDAY PRESENT TONIGHT?--A BED BIG ENOUGH FOR US ALL! (Maria: You wouldn't get much sleep that way!) I'd get a lot of sleep tonight, but wait till the morning! There's a full moon tonight! (Maria: I heard FC had a bed big enough for eight people once, & they used it too!) I can remember when I was a little boy, David, they used to sleep four or five of us in
