




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He's the Picture

*courteous: to be thoughtful of the feelings of others





...then they'll understand that Jesus must love and care about them too.



*considerate: thoughtful of others and their feelings

So it's important for you children to have good manners...






Then when people look at you, they'll see that Jesus takes care of you. They'll believe what your daddy or mommy told them.
