'Banks Are Out of Control!'

"The Crash of '79" is the latest bestselling novel by American financier-turned-author Paul Erdman. His story paints a realistic doomsday scenario of an Arab pullout of petrodollars from the U.S., a nuclear war in the Mideast over Arab oil and ultimately a global economic collapse. Newsweek's Rita Palmer recently talked to Erdman, 45, about the "Crash". Excerpts:

Q. Do you really believe a war over oil reserves is possible?

A. I think the test on this will probably come, say, in the mid-1980's when the actual physical supply of crude petroleum starts to go down. What can result is a rivalry over the diminishing absolute amount of oil available. Then you can have military clashes.

Q. Again and again in "The Crash" you downplay the role of Israel.

A. The primary issue is not Israel. The real issues are energy, who should control it and what kind of special relationship the U.S. should establish with Saudi Arabia, the country which is allowing us to drive our cars around.

Q. In your book, the U.S. President is terribly ignorant about what is going on. Is that realistic?

A. Traditionally, our presidents don't know much about economics, and they know zilch about international economics. I think Presi-



dent Jimmy Carter is following completely in this great American tradition.

Q. You have the Saudis pulling their short-term funds out of the U.S. in your book and this causes a bank run in the U.S. Is this feasible now?

A. If Barbara Walters tells us on the evening news that the Saudis are yanking out their dough, it could very well be that you and I are going to line up at the bank the next morning and get our money out too!

Q. Would the crash be a replay of '29?

A. Well, '29 was a domestic crisis.

My crash is definitely an international crisis, a total financial crisis. The most important factors are the international banks, and when those dominoes start to fall then everything goes.

Q. How precarious is the financial system?

A. It's precarious. The large American banks are out of control in regard to their international operations. There is a large amount of what I would call irresponsible lending to non-oil-producing LDC's (Third World). These countries are obviously not in a position to repay these loans at maturity.

Q. Your hero is the financial adviser to the Saudis. How canny are the Arabs in their financial dealings?

A. The Arabs traditionally work with a list of 50 of the largest banks in the world. They are very conservative. They give their money to the bank and say, 'you manage it'—which brings up a funny situation. The Arabs are giving their money to the large banks and these banks are lending to the LDC's. What the Arabs cleverly have done is put the New York banks in the front row of risk. In other words, if Zaire goes kaput, Chase Manhattan is in trouble.

"If even one link, like oil, breaks in the chain of their economic system, it can cause a sudden depression or a sudden panic or a sudden collapse of the whole System!" (284:42)
