

Security In Closed Countries!

Letter from Hosanna in Athens

Dear Folks and Timothy,

After reading a report from A. in Jordan, I wanted to pass on this part to you, as I felt it might be beneficial in helping the Family avoid these sorts of situations which have endangered different selah fields in the past. From A's report:

"A guy I work with, an American who is a pretty big goat, went to Portugal and met the Family there. That's fine as far as I'm concerned, but the Family he met went and told him that I was in the Family, my Bible name and gave him some lit. I think they met him while listening. Giving him lit is fine, but—" "To go and tell people the names and so forth of people in selah fields is really dangerous! This guy is definitely not a good friend of ours because of some of his dirty tricks and bad deals. When he told me he'd met some of my 'friends' in Portugal, I was curious to know who and what happened. He said, 'They told me your name was _____ and they wrote their names on this pamphlet by Moses David.' He just smirked!"

"I think it's come to the point where there should be a policy in the Family not to go exposing members in selah fields. I know that in some situations, a breach like this could really cost a life! When you're virtually illegal and trying to carry on a witness in secret, you can't afford to be spotlighted. I don't think these brethren meant us any harm and wanted to help us and get

out a Letter. But it certainly doesn't help us to have our cover blown!"

"In Germany, the sister of a girl we've gotten saved met the Family who put her on their mailing list and faithfully sent her lit. Our sheep hasn't even told her sister about us because she knows our security situation! This way, it's fantastic because—

"They're both getting fed and it's not endangering us at all! But if the brethren in Germany tried to get them in touch with us here, it could really blow everything because we'd be spotlighted as the leaders of the 'FOL' organisation here."

"I think we should encourage the brethren abroad to put the Arabs they meet on their own personal or Home mailing lists. The Arabs love mail and really respect literature. But for us to do it from here or to be even slightly connected to it could mean anything from deportation to imprisonment!"

"I don't know how it is in other Arab countries, but in the two years I've been here I have come to realise that you can't get away with too much. The people here know a lot.—Total strangers know more about me and tell me where I live, how much my rent is, my income and a whole list of things!—More than even some of my best friends and close associates know!"

"Maybe we should bring up these things to protect some of our new selah works in even more difficult fields such as Poland, Iraq or Saudi

Arabia. It wouldn't be a joke to be exposed as FOL in Saudi, but I don't think many brethren realise that..."

I think A's point of the European or North American Homes following up directly with the Arabs they meet through the mail needs to be stressed, rather than prematurely "spotlighting" our selah brethren; even giving out their postal address is dangerous!—Or taking for granted that they can follow up, as is possible in Western fields.

Then perhaps as a real bond has been established with the person they're feeding through the mail, the Home in Europe or America can then contact the Home in the selah field, giving a brief history of the person, what Letters they've read, if they're saved, etc. and leave it to the selah field if they want to fol-

low up on him or not.

I'm sure other near-serious situations could have been avoided if all the Family were better aware of the deadly serious need for security in these selah drop-in works. One thing that those less familiar with Arabs need to keep in mind is that usually Arabs are much freer on foreign turf away from home, whereas in their home country, due to social mores, they are constrained to be much more conservative. And even the hospitality they generously extend while abroad may be more difficult for them to follow through on at home. Hope this helps everyone to be more security-minded!

WE ARE NOT PLAYING GAMES: This is a deadly serious business and one mistake could be fatal! (No. 43.)

WE NEVER MAIL A LETTER without us both double checking and even triple checking the contents, the packaging, the addressing, the return address and the postage and total general appearance. (No. 28.)

WE USUALLY PLACE OUR MAIL INSIDE OF TWO THIN AIR-MAIL ENVELOPES, the one in-

side of the other so that nothing can possibly be seen through the envelope. (No. 29.)

PAY ATTENTION TO THE CHECKS OF THE SPIRIT and heed God's still small voice when it checks you, "No, don't do that!" Our security really is in God's hands most of all and we have to depend on Him to take care of us and protect us and keep us in spite of our own stupid mistakes. (No. 76.)
