## Housekeeping Hints for New Moms!

HOW TO BE A HAPPY NURSING MOTHER—NOT A FRANTIC HOUSEWIFE!

(Taken from "Nursing Your Baby" by Karen Pryor; Pocket Books, New York, Chapter 12: "Housework Housekeeping")

(With smaller Homes, I think more Moms are finding they are not only having to care for their children pretty much on their own but also having to take care of the bulk of the household work as well, especially where many of the brethren are now taking drop-in jobs. The suggestions in this chapter were a help to me, so maybe you'll find it a help too! Love, Mesheliah, Greece.)

**WHEN YOUR HUSBAND LEAVES FOR WORK**, quickly make the bed; then at least something's done. Put the breakfast dishes in the sink, & cover them with hot soapy water. That gets them out of sight, & meanwhile the grease & food is soaking loose.

**THEN TAKE A VERY BIG BAG** & walk around the living room & bedrooms, putting everything into the bag that needs to be disposed of: crumbs, newspapers, magazines, opened envelopes, bits of toys, & all the other clutter a room acquires in a day. You can put pillows back & gather up toys as you go. Don't put everything away separately; never walk down a hall or up the stairs with just one or two things in your

then take them along when you're going there anyway.

**THEN TAKE A PAD OF TOILET TISSUE, WET IT WITH ALCOHOL**, & quickly wipe the bathroom fixtures. Alcohol is cheap, disinfectant, leaves no odor & makes chrome shine. Then with a broom or carpet sweeper, quickly clean up the middle of the living room & kitchen.

**NOW SIT DOWN & RELAX.** You've worked about 15 minutes & your house is clean & neat looking. If someone drops in, you won't be embarrassed. If you never get a chance to do another thing all day, you're still ahead, because the depressing, overwhelming mess is gone.

**LATER ON, YOU CAN RINSE OFF THOSE DISHES** & start the laundry. Then plan what you're going to have for dinner. That way there will be no last minute scramble. In the late afternoon, take a walk in the sunshine. Then, just before your husband comes home, go around the livingroom quickly, & set the table.

He will see that everything is nice & neat, & if the table is set, he'll feel optimistic about the chances of getting dinner pretty soon.

**CONFINE THE CHILDREN'S TOYS TO ONE ROOM.** Big baskets or even cardboard boxes are good for keeping toys—B boots & sporting equipment—in one spot & out of sight. Convenience is more important than style. To quote the La Leche League manual,

**ORDER BEFORE PRETTINESS,** convenience before style, & above all, people before things. Sure, it would be great to have the floors waxed all the time, like those on the TV commercials, & to have interiors with that un-lived-in look, like the cover of a magazine.

## FAMILY MEMBERS' VISIT HOME MAKES NEWS!

**WIDE "SHOW & TELL"** by the Children of God at the urging of the controversial cult's leader & prophet, Moses David. Hargett said he is "just here to show we're not held against our will & free to come & go." **HARGETT SAID HE EXPECTED TO RETURN TO ASIA** in June. "We really loved it over there & enjoyed our work," he said. Hargett had been in the C.O.G. for a year in Hawaii, five years in Japan & several

years in the U.S. "You're just free to go where you wish to go," Hargett said. "You start a home & you're independent. You finance your own thing thru' your prayer letters or going out for donors."

**HE WORKED FOR THE CAMPUS CRUSADE** for Christ for 1 1/2 years in California before his Marine Corps service. He was a Marine in Hawaii when he was introduced to the C.O.G. "I've always been a Christian," he said. "I've always had strong convictions that I always wanted to do something for the Lord. But I just never really found the right thing."

**WHAT DO THEY DO IN ASIA?** "We witness," Hargett said. "We tell people about Jesus...We try to give feet to our prayers & so do something for people. You can't tell a hungry guy that Jesus loves him; we've got to feed his stomach. In the process we meet people who really like what we're doing & they help us out (financially)."

**HIS CRITICISM OF BOTH CAMPUS CRUSADE** for Christ & the Jesus Movement of the late '60's & early '70's was, essentially, that those groups did not devote all of their time to witnessing. "That's one of the reasons I didn't join one of the other groups in the Jesus Revolution he said. 'I didn't feel they were dedicated. I wanted to make it a way of life, to experience the Bible to the fullest.'"

**WHEN THE GROUP WAS ACTIVE HERE**, members gave up their own names for Biblical names. That's no longer required, Hargett said. "My name was Adam, but now I just use Ken," Hargett said. He responded to the criticism of the C.O.G.: "NOBODY KICKS A DEAD DOG. When you're on the move, you're bound to take criticism. There's always somebody who doesn't like you. We've been trying new ways of witnessing & have upset the fruit basket, so to speak." He said his mother paid for his trip to Seattle from Asia.

**REFERRING TO MOSES DAVID**, Hargett said, "A lot of people say we're just following some man. But following him is following Jesus. Like Paul said, 'Be followers of me as I am also of Christ.'"
