## PLUGGED WASHBASINS & SINKS!

Whether it concerns a kitchen sink  
or a washbasin, this problem can occur  
frequently, but rarely is it serious. In  
most instances you will be able to han-  
dle it quite easily yourself without  
having to call a plumber.

It is good to remember that the  
drainage pipes of a sink do not sudden-  
ly block up, and that often there are ad-  
vance warning signs of impending trouble.  
Therefore, when you note that the basin  
is not draining as quickly as it should,  
take care of it right away. This will only  
take a few minutes and will save you  
from having more serious problems later  
on which you might not be able to take  
care of by yourself.

The obstruction is due to foreign  
matter (hair, kitchen refuse, etc.) which  
is caught in the pipes and ends up creat-  
ing a jam, more or less preventing any  
water from passing through the pipes.

Usually the jam is in the elbow joint  
which connects the basin drain to the  
main drainage pipe. There are several  
types of elbow joints, but all can be  
taken apart to allow them to be cleaned.  
The most recent model have a little cov-  
er on their base. This is usually  
screwed on or held tight by 2 small  
screws.

There are different methods of clear-  
ing the drainpipes, depending on which  
part of the pipe is plugged.

• If the obstruction is situated before  
the elbow joint, stick a length of metal  
wire down the drain hole and pull out  
the obstruction.

• If the obstruction is farther down,  
use a plunger or a special chemical  
product.

• If the obstruction is in the elbow  
joint, take it apart and clean it.

• If none of the above measures work,  
the problem is probably in the main  
drainage pipe and you will have to call  
a plumber.


As you do not know in advance exact-  
ly where the problem is, start by the  
first possibility and don't take apart  
the joint until you are sure that the  
problem is not in the plug hole drain.

### RECOMMENDATIONS:

- If you have difficulty unscrewing the elbow joint, lubricate it with a few drops of oil and then gently force it in both directions. In most cases this will loosen it.
- To clear out piping, plumbers use a 'ferret'. This is a long flexible rod with a small metallic brush on the end. If you have frequent problems with your plumbing, be sure to get one. They are available in hardware stores at reason-  
able prices.
- Avoid letting hair and hot grease go down your sink. Grease will harden and  
create obstructions in your drainage pipes.



1) When a sink or washbasin is blocked,  
the obstruction is often due to an accu-  
mulation of matter caught between the  
plughole and the elbow joint. After  
having taken off the plug of the basin,  
start by cleaning out the drainage pipe  
with a rigid piece of metal wire hook-  
ed at the end.

2) If this does not free the pipes, the  
obstruction could be further down in the  
elbow joint. Try using a plunger design-  
ed for sinks and take the following  
steps: a) Take out the plug and  
fill the sink with water, as the  
plunger must be immersed in water. Posi-  
tion the plunger so that it plugs the  
plughole in a watertight manner. b) Push  
up and down suddenly on the plunger sev-  
eral times. The resulting suction will  
displace the obstruction and cause it to  
drain off. Repeat this as often as is  
necessary.

3) If it is still blocked, you can also  
use a commercial chemical product. These  
usually have a base of caustic powder  
and dissolve any obstructions composed  
of organic matters. Be sure to read the  
instructions carefully, as there are  
certain precautions to take.

4) If this does not free the pipes, put  
a plastic basin under the elbow joint  
(or trap) and take off the lower part.  
This could be screwed directly onto the  
body of the joint or held in place by 2  
small screws.

5) Use a piece of metal wire to clean  
out the joint and run some water to  
rinse out the pipes.

6) Water drainage pipes are often equip-  
ped with maintenance plugs at curves in  
the pipe, as obstructions often form  
there. These plugs can be removed and  
the pipe cleaned out if necessary.



1) I pull out the plug and clean the  
drain with a piece of wire.




2) To obtain good results with the  
plunger, I follow the instructions  
on the opposite page.



3) I cleaned out the drain and obtain good  
results. I should be used with pre-  
caution.



4) The foreign matter has accumu-  
lated in the elbow joint, or trap.  
I take apart the joint.



5) I scrape and clear out the in-  
terior of the joint with a length of  
metal wire.



6) In following the pipes I might  
find a maintenance plug where ob-  
structions might occur.
