16 Health Emergencies and What to Do First

Every year, thousands of people are confronted with life-threatening emergencies. Many die when they might have been saved by proper treatment given in time. Here we present some common life and death situations and advice on how to handle them. In each instance, it is assumed that medical assistance has been called or will be as soon as possible.

Abdominal Pain

Your child complains of a tummy ache. His stomach seems hard and is tender to the touch. He's also nauseated and slightly feverish.

The first major symptom of appendicitis is usually discomfort throughout the abdomen. Put your youngster to bed and apply an ice pack to the affected area. Give him nothing to eat or drink before you consult the doctor. Food or drink may increase the risk of rupturing the appendix and cause the situa-tion to become critical. Do not give laxatives for any type of abdominal pain.

Asphyxiation After being rescued from his burn-ing house, a neighbor is unconscious from smoke inhalation.

To administer mouth-to-mouth resuscitation to an asphyxiation victim, first open the victim's air pas-sage by tilting his head back and lifting his lower jaw. Next, pinch his nose closed. Then blow into his mouth hard enough to make his chest rise. Continue resuscitation at

the rate of 12 breaths per minute.

Don't despair and give up too soon. There have been times when victims were revived after hours of

rescue breathing.

Dog Bites

An unknown dog attacks your little girl and bites her leg.

Consider any dog rabid until

proved otherwise, and act fast. Rinse the bite under running water to remove the dog's saliva. Next, use gauze to scrub the wound with
