1. SINCE WE'VE EXPLAINED TO YOU IN PART ONE WHAT A BIBLE CURRICULUM BASICALLY ENTAILS, LET'S CONTINUE NOW WITH A FEW EXAMPLE CHAPTERS FROM THE OLD TESTAMENT & how the various areas of memory work, re-search & 3 H's & 3 G's could possibly fit into your daily Bible studies with children of all ages. Because there is of course not room enough here to cover every aspect or every idea that could be included in a Bible study, this chapter is just a basic outline to give you an idea of how to interrelate several subjects under one Bible study topic. Hopefully you can apply these ideas, add on or simplify, & be inspired with more of your own ideas through prayer to make each of your Bible studies an actual school & learning course for children. Your Bible-based program will actually depend on you, your burden, Bible knowledge & of course, time attributed to your children's schooling.

2. THE REAL ADVANTAGE OF CHARTING THESE IS IN PUTTING AS MANY SUGGESTIONS AS WE CAN AFFORDABLE FOR YOU IS SO THAT YOU AND YOURS WILL FORMULATE YOUR OWN COMBINATION BIBLE CURRICULUM to your own liking, according to your own schedule. If you have only 1 to 1 1/2 hours of schooltime each day, as I often do, at least with your own charted outline you'll know exactly where to begin & have many ideas to go on so you don't waste any time wondering what to do for school that day! Please understand the these school subjects, if at all covered under one Bible chapter study, could take a long, long time, depending

on what you put into it!--It's taken us three months to cover Genesis, Exodus & Daniel in our Bible-School!

3. YOU COULD CHOOSE EACH DAY WHAT AREA YOU NEED TO TEACH THE MOST. For instance, if your child is behind in Spelling & Geography study, perhaps he could write out a few new Spelling words of terms from a Bible map after you've had your Bible lesson chapter that day. Another child may practice finding his memory verse in the Bible, or researching dictionary definitions if this is what he needs the most work on. Please keep in mind that Math oftentimes has to be included in your school schedule on a regular basis if you're to keep up with needed lessons on basic Arithmetic for young children. Math is not always so easy to enter into a Bible study; there-

fore don't neglect Math just because it doesn't always relate to your Bible study, but rather schedule it weekly in your curriculum outline.

Please adapt these lessons to the age, abilities & interests of your own children. Pray for leading & guidance & wisdom & love as I had often prays for us in our daily care & training of the children here. Have fun! Make it fun & follow along at your children's own learning pace. Just think! You could study through the whole Bible this way in a very thorough & beneficial way with just a simple, planned Bible Curriculum, & oh yes! 5. LET'S LEARN MORE ABOUT GOD'S WORD & HOW TO USE IT! Here's a little poem to help you remember the books of the Bible:

"The word Bible means 'books',

66 to be exact.

39 in the front,

27 in the back!"

There are 66 books in the Bible, written by about 40 men, or actually, by Jesus! John 1:1; 2Tim.3:16,17: The Bible is a love-letter to you from Jesus!

6. THE TWO MAIN DIVISIONS ARE THE OLD TESTAMENT & THE NEW TESTAMENT. The Old Testament has 39 books & was translated from the Hebrew language. The New Testament has 27 books & was translated from the Greek language, by inspired Bible scholars. The word "testament" means covenant, contract, or promise. The Old Testament is a covenant between God & any child of God. The New Testament is a contract between God & the "ekklesia", the Greek word meaning "the called out", the body of believers, like us!
