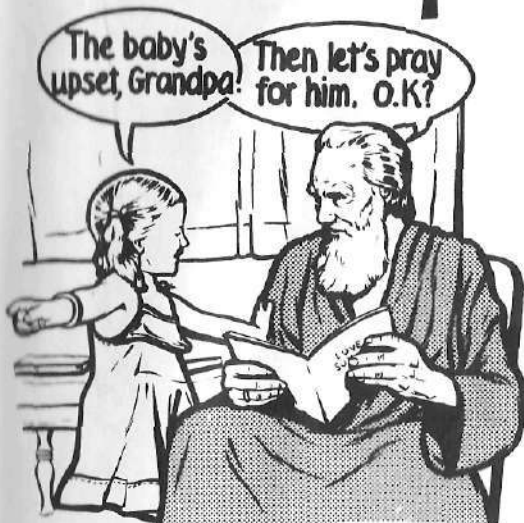


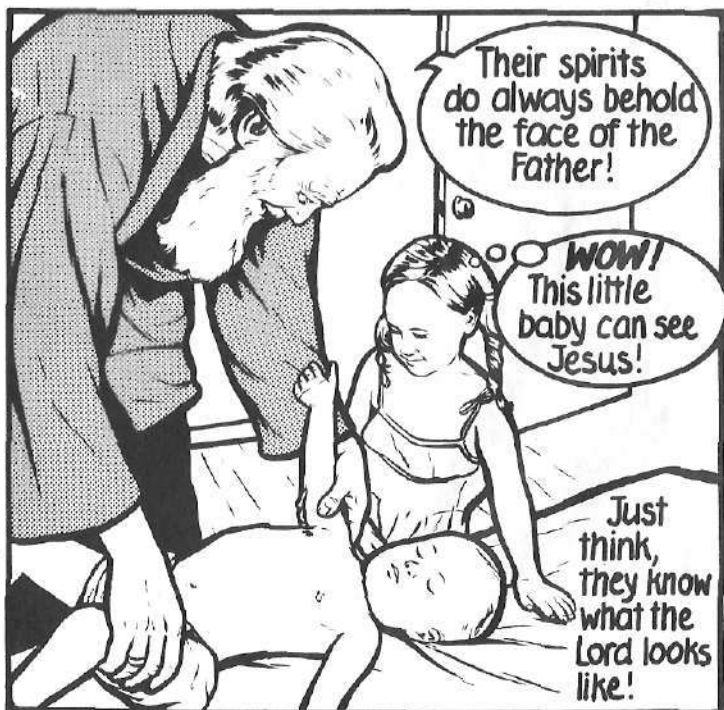


They Behold His face!
